*The crime and calls for service information, provided by the crime analysis units/planning units in each agency, was compiled by the Tempe Police Department Crime Analysis Unit. This report is based on Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) criteria which are not equivalent to Arizona Revised Statutes (ARS) statistics and therefore this data cannot be directly compared to ARS reports. Under the hierarchy rule of UCR, only the most severe offense of an incident is counted. Therefore, for example, burglary offenses are only counted where the burglary is the most severe offense committed in the incident. The above tables include dispatched/callback calls for service only. Arizona Department of Economic Security official population estimates were used. Any incidents that had missing or incorrect information may not be properly depicted in this report. Other caveats to this information include:*
