SWING INTO SPRING TRAINING AT TEMPE DIABLO STADIUM



Are you ready to tear into a bag of peanuts and put on a baseball cap? It's almost time for Cactus League Spring Training! Hear the crack of a bat and smell the fresh-cut grass while watching America's favorite pastime as the Angels return to their spring home in Tempe.

The Angels will host the Chicago Cubs at [Tempe Diablo stadium](#) for their spring training home opener on Saturday, Feb. 23. The season will run through March 27 at Tempe Diablo Stadium, when the Angels will take on the Texas Rangers. Tickets are available [online](#) or you can purchase them at the Tempe Diablo box office beginning Feb. 9.

The annual charity game will be held at 1:05 p.m. on Sunday, Feb. 24 and the

Angels take on the Oakland Athletics. All proceeds from ticket sales, parking, concessions and merchandise from the game will go directly to the [Tempe Diablos](#) local charities. This year's game will support [Rachel's Challenge](#), an organization focused on preventing bullying in schools.

Fans can park and get a free ride to the stadium with the return of the [Angels Spring Training trolley](#). Game attendees

are encouraged to park at one of four Downtown Tempe [Park-It](#) locations, board the trolley and let someone else do the driving. The trolley will circulate between the Mill Avenue District and Tempe Diablo Stadium every 20 minutes beginning two hours before game time, until 30 minutes after game time on game days.

TEMPE HISTORY MUSEUM CELEBRATES BLACK HISTORY MONTH

I have a dream.

Those four words have become synonymous with a call for equality. On Saturday, Feb. 9 at 6:30 p.m., Elmer Green will recite this famous speech by [Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.](#) at the third annual Black History Month celebration at the [Tempe History Museum](#). The event is free and appropriate for all ages.

Green knows seven of Dr. King's speeches verbatim. He has been reciting them with great passion for more than 30 years in the Greater-Phoenix area. In addition to the speech, there will be a performance by the Hester Sisters and contemporary jazz from New Groove. David Toliver Sr. from the [Archer-Ragsdale Arizona Chapter](#) of the Tuskegee Airmen will give a presentation about the heroic efforts of the [Tuskegee Airmen of WWII](#), recently featured in the hit movie, [Red Tails](#).

The Archer-Ragsdale Arizona Chapter is named in honor of two original Tuskegee Airmen, Fred Archer, the first African American USAF Chief Master Sergeant and Lincoln Ragsdale, a Civil Rights leader and prominent businessman in the Phoenix area after completing his military obligation as a P-51 fighter pilot at Luke Air Force Base.

The Tempe History Museum will also host a screening of the release of "A Legacy in the Valley," a documentary film featuring the life and legacy of two African American woman pioneers, who made history in the state of Arizona. Recognized and designated as an Arizona Centennial Legacy Project, the film tells the story of Helen K. Mason and her great grandmother Mary Green, the first African-American woman to settle in Phoenix.

TEMPE YOUTH BECOME POLICYMAKERS FOR A DAY



More than 100 youth and community leaders will exchange ideas and propose solutions for issues facing young people at Tempe's 33rd annual [Youth Town Hall](#) on Tuesday, Feb. 12.

Youth Town Hall, which is presented by the Mayor's Youth Advisory Commission (MYAC), gives youth the opportunity to have direct impact on policies affecting them. Middle and high school students in Tempe participate in the policy-making process by engaging in dialogue with community decision makers, including school board members, business leaders and public service agencies. Recommendations from the Youth Town Hall are submitted to the Mayor and City Council for possible action or policy change.

The topics to be discussed at this year's event are teen healthy relationships, school transitions and career planning, and teen volunteerism and civic engagement. Past Youth Town Hall events have resulted in the formation of youth programs such as teen leadership training, school-based counseling and life skills groups, school-based after school prevention programs, violence prevention programs and daycare for teen parents attending school.

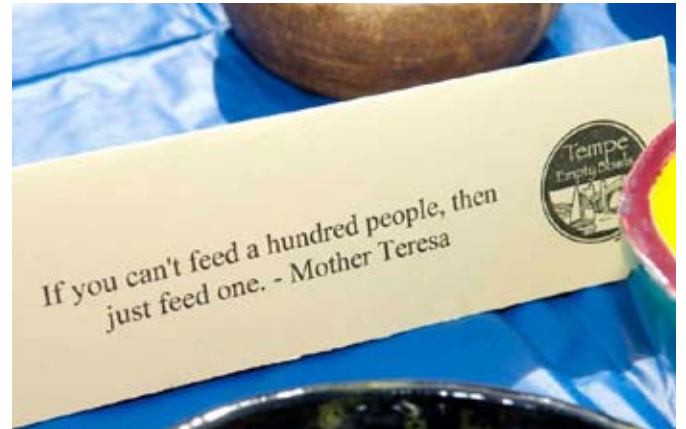

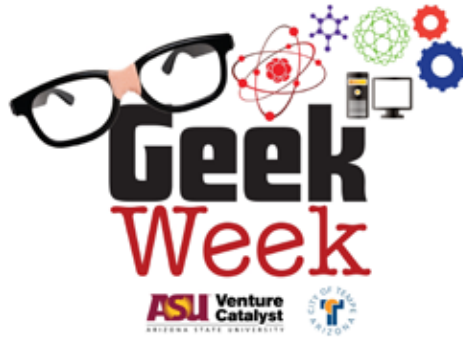

TEMPE TOWN LAKE CLEAN-UP

As a result of the hard freezes the Valley of the Sun experienced earlier this year, thousands of fish died, some of which resided at [Tempe Town Lake](#). The fish are Tilapia, a tropical fish that can't survive in cold temperatures.

Crews have been working for the past week to remove the dead fish. When

the fish die, they sink to the bottom of the lake and then float to the surface about 10-14 days later. The rain and heavy water flow from last week's storms carried additional Tilapia from lakes, ponds and rivers upstream. The City hopes to have the situation resolved this week.
