TEMPE MUSIC REVIVAL

This November, Mill Avenue is breathing new life into its legendary music scene with a series of performances by local bands in the new Tempe Music Revival series. Taking inspiration from local bands like the Gin Blossoms, Jimmy Eat World and Roger Clyne & the Peacemakers who got their start in downtown Tempe, this free, family-friendly series aims to reinvigorate the live music scene downtown.

On three Fridays and one Wednesday this month, the public will get to rock out to the musical stylings of local bands from 5-8 p.m. on Sixth Street just east of Mill Avenue.

Kiwanis offers its free swim sessions Monday through Thursday from 11:30 a.m. -1:30 p.m., and again from 5:30-8 p.m. through Dec. 5. Regular admission for children ages 2-12 years old is \$3; ages 13 and older are \$4.





MADE IN TEMPE

The Tempe History Museum's Made in Tempe exhibit features items that have been manufactured, constructed or formed here in the past or currently. Historically, Tempe was a farming town that produced agricultural products; today, Tempe makes a well-rounded inventory of products - some based on technology, some food-based and others anticipating the future.

Made in Tempe opens at 5:30 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 8. and runs through August 2014. Listen to music by Tempe-based band, Bears of Manitou, and get a chance to sample products such as DeCio Pasta, made by participating companies. The Tempe Chamber of Commerce will perform a ribbon cutting ceremony at approximately 6 p.m. Admission is free.




RECYCLE ALMOST ANYTHING AT TEMPE'S ZERO WASTE DAY

Tempe residents are encouraged to clean closets, clear out sheds, purge garage piles and bring it all to the city's Zero Waste Day recycling event from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday, Nov. 16 at the Tempe Fire Training Facility.

- Recycling: Books, building supplies (no cement), electronic equipment (calculators, cameras, cell phones, computers and monitors, DVD players, VCRs, telephones, televisions), golf balls, household hazardous waste (cleaning supplies, lawn and pool chemicals, paint, etc.), household textiles (clothing, linens, towels), belts, hats, shoes (all types), purses, wallets, soft/stuffed toys, plastic shopping bags, school supplies, tires, appliances (dishwashers, refrigerators, stoves), paper, cardboard and other recyclables.
- **Document shredding**: Secure, confidential document shredding.
- Compost and paint giveaway: Each participating Tempe resident can receive a free bag of compost from Tempe's green waste program, as well as up to 20 gallons of paint.
- Canned food drive: Participants are asked to donate a canned food item to help <u>Tempe Community Action</u> <u>Agency's</u> food pantry.

All items will be recycled, reused or disposed of in an environmentally safe manner. Items must be clean and sanitary. Proof of Tempe residency is required (e.g., driver's license or utility bill). For more information, visit www. tempe.gov/recycling or call the Recycle Hotline at 480-350-4311.
