## **About the Artists**

Katherine Nicholson received a bachelor of fine arts degree in sculpture and printmaking from Washington University in St. Louis and a master of fine arts in printmaking from Arizona State University. Her current work on paper concentrates on signs of life left behind in the environment. Much like

the marks made by artists, these "trails" made by nature. animals and humans reveal tangible evidence of life and time gone by. They mark movement and relationships within the natural world over a non-linear timeline.

The marks for this body of work were collected from the Sonoran Desert and the Salt River east of Phoenix. She recorded the marks left by animals by placing coated copper etching plates in the desert, by pulling sheets of handmade paper directly in the current of the river, by gathering algae and

other matter from the river and by making impressions into clay with objects found at the river. The data collection process helped her to define a relationship with the environment and create her own visual vocabulary while doing so in the most non-invasive manner possible.

Long-time Valley resident and Phoenix-based artist Jeff Falk has seen first-hand the growth of the city and the art scene. He has studied art at Glendale Community College, Arizona State University and Phoenix College and has shown his work in more than 200 exhibitions in the United States. Canada

> and Mexico. He has been active in the local art scene for many years and met his wife and fellow artist, Annie Lopez, through M.A.R.S., Movimiento Artistico Del Rio Salado, an artist run cooperative in Phoenix.
