

I. Background

The north side of Kiwanis Park (Baseline Road to Kiwanis Lake) is scheduled for enhancements. Proposed concepts include improvements for the inclusive playground, concessions, and restroom buildings as well as potential designs for a new dog park and other amenities. A public meeting was held on June 3 from 8 to 10 a.m. at Kiwanis Park and a survey was available online at <u>tempe.gov/Forum</u> from June 3 through June 18, 2023, to gather feedback on the proposed concepts. This survey received a total of 127 visitors and 94 responses.

II. Outreach

Several methods were used to provide information to the public and stakeholders regarding the project, meeting and opportunities for input.


This third round of outreach was focused on obtaining feedback for proposed playground layouts and color palettes, concession and restroom design, as well as artistic feedback for artist Bobby Zokaites. The additional focus groups outside of the Tempe Forum allowed for the direct input from the community to ensure the park improvements meets the needs for all.

Yard signs with meeting and comment information were placed in Kiwanis Park.


Emails


III. Survey Results


58 respondents provided an address with approximately 85% in Tempe.




1. Do you prefer playground layout option A or playground layout option B??

7. Do you have any additional comment regarding the proposed dog park, playground and concession/restroom layouts?

- 1. Another connection to the Western Canal at the south end of the parking lot would be useful. Parks department should work with Streets to make sure the Kyrene bikeway and the pedestrian light across Baseline gets built. Connection from all neighborhoods is vital and right now, it is inconvenient for anyone arriving from Kyrene/US-60 area on foot or by bike.
- 2. Can you add more space for those with other needs. I don't know where to take my mother so she can enjoy the outdoors without wandering off. Maybe an enclosed area with stimulating and calming features? The new area looks great for kids and people with dogs. Can you keep expanding ideas to include others in the community with special needs? Thank you.



- 55. The greater the shaded areas the better. Families can spend longer periods enjoying the park area


- 56. There may not be enough parking close to the dog park. There should be more Ramadas close to the playground and cloud for birthdays"








Do children in the following age groups live in Tempe with you?
