SUBJECT: Neighborhood Advisory Commission Composition



The Neighborhood Advisory Commission was established by Mayor and Council in November 2000 based on a recommendation from a city formed task force, Tempe Neighborhoods Tomorrow. The task force was made up of residents representing Tempe's then four zip code areas and members spent 18 months studying, researching and compiling a report on Tempe neighborhood issues.


One of the recommendations from the task force was the establishment of a permanent Neighborhood Commission to advise the City Council and staff on neighborhood issues. The task force also drafted the guidelines for the proposed commission through a public process that included existing neighborhood and homeowners' associations. Based on all of the input received, the Neighborhood Advisory Commission was formed with the following guidelines for its composition.

"The Neighborhood Advisory Commission is composed of 15 members. Members are appointed proportionately to the geographic distribution of population by zip codes, subject to change as population shifts occur. Each member of the Commission must have been a resident of Tempe for at least one year prior to the appointment. Terms are for three years."

Based on Census 2020 population numbers as well as the creation of a new zip code for Tempe, the Commission's current number of members per zip code is:

#### **INDIGENOUS ARTS & CULTURE**

As the City recently celebrated Indigenous People's Day, Arts and Culture teams continue to grow collaborations with local Indigenous artists and communities through a range of programs and initiatives.

#### Hekiu - Indigenous Artist Continuum

On Thursday October 5, Arts and Culture and Sustainability staff supported the launch of the Hekiu ('hook-yu') at TCA. Hekiu is a new collective of artists, designers, and culture bearers from O'odham, Piipaash, and Yoeme (Yacqui) communities. The event involved a presentation of proposed principles and examples of practical action for advancing visibility of our most local Indigenous artists and designers within our City. It is the culmination of 2 years of collaboration. Staff are now working with Hekiu to develop a number of pilot projects that put these principles into action. #### Large Scale O'odham artwork

Recently TCA Gallery celebrated the installation of a stunning and colorful artwork by Dwayne Manuel (O'odham) that is inspired by O'odham baskets, and which spans multiple glass windows across the Lakeside and Lobby. The artwork will remain for several months (photo on the left).

#### Indígena

a celebration of Latin
 American indigenous people

On Indigenous People's Day, TCA partnered with Cultural Coalition to successfully present *Indígena*, a celebration of Indigenous people of Latin America. The free event spanned the lobby, North Patio and gallery, and attracted a diverse crowd of over 500 people, who participated in the music, food, dance, and visual art of traditional and contemporary Indigenous cultures (photo on the right).

#### Native American performance at TCA

In November, TCA will present three Native American performances. One Way Sky (Gila River/Tohono O'odham) will perform a concert at TCA on November 2. Joe Rainey (Red Lake Ojibwe) brings his unique 'techno pow wow' on Nov 9, and Levi Platero (**Diné**) will present an energetic blues rock on Nov 18. These programs are part of TCA's ongoing commitment to presenting high quality music, deepening a

sense of connection and belonging, and reflecting the diversity of who we are as a City.


