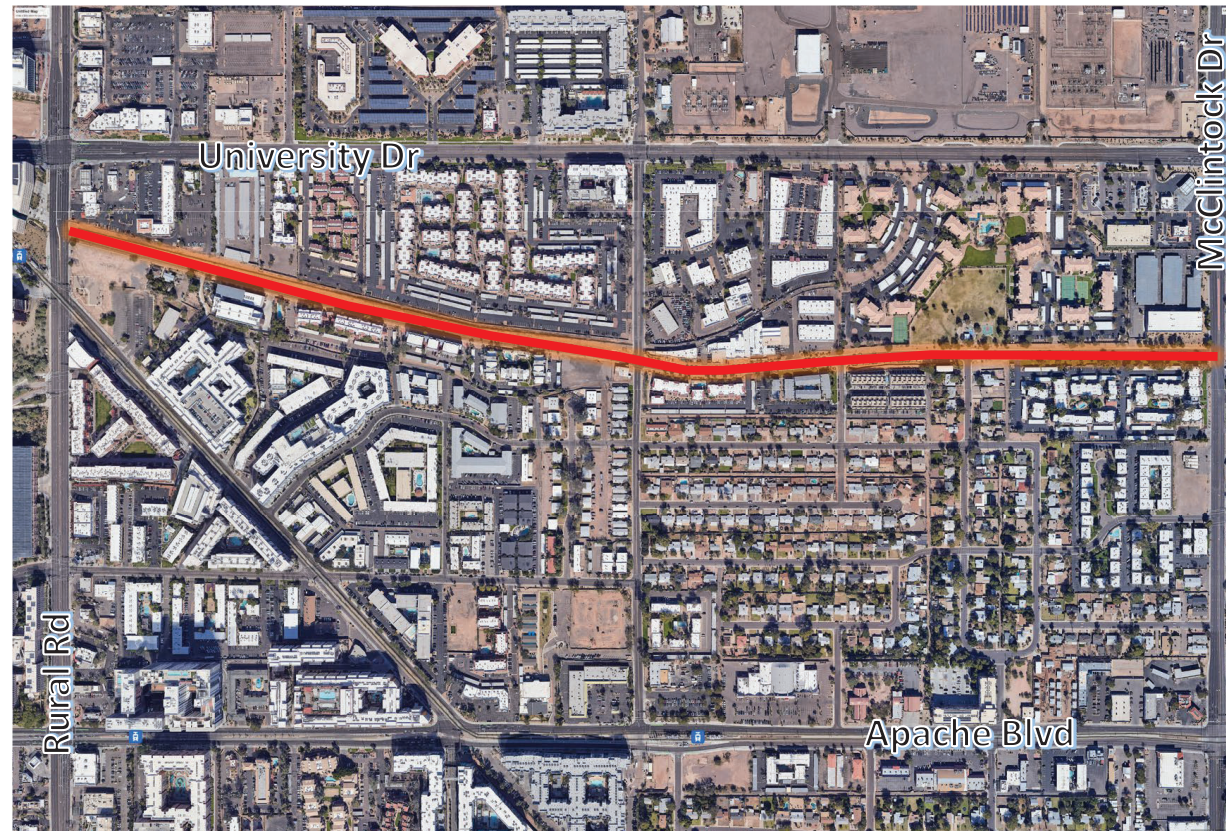
This Project

Proposed Improvements include:

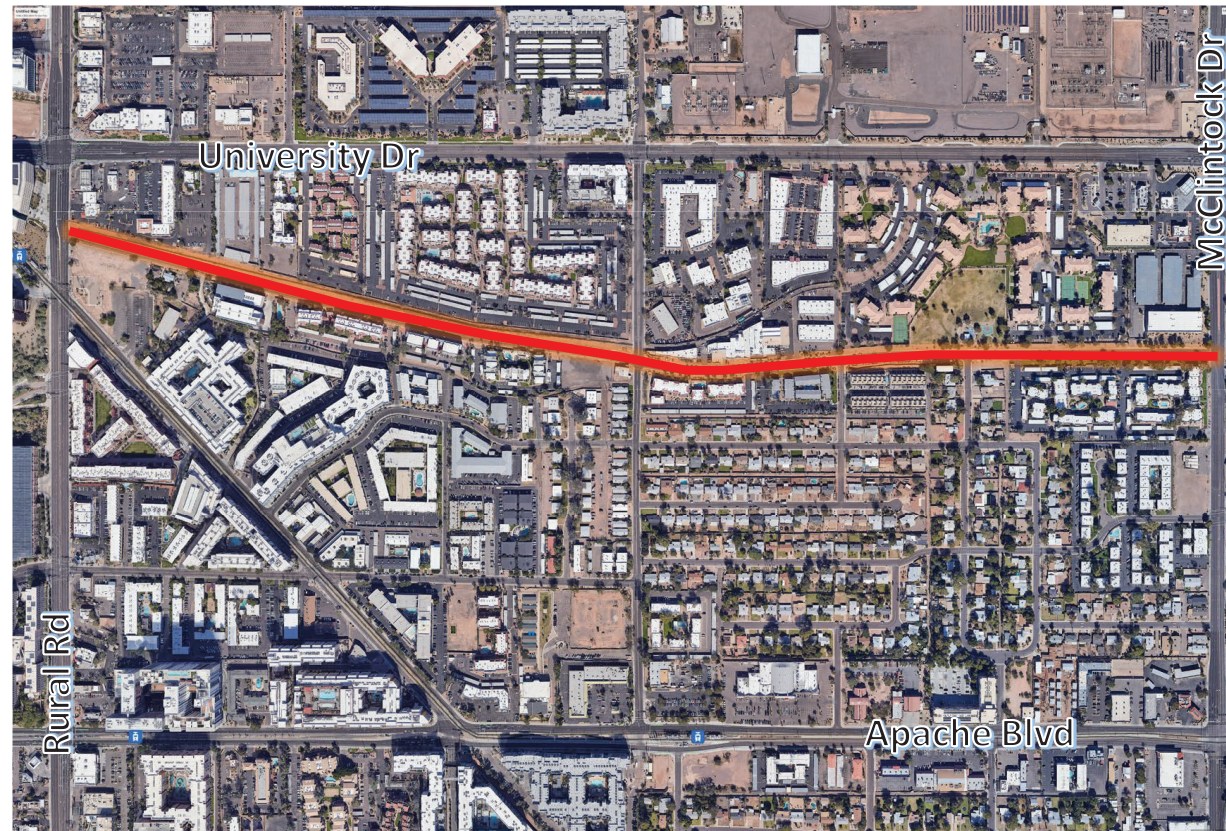
- Raised Crosswalks
- Traffic Calming
- Directional Ramps
- Reconfigured Parking
- Bike lanes from McClintock to Dorsey Lane
- Off-street multi-use path/shared-lane markings from Dorsey Lane to Rural Road
- Landscaping
- Lighting

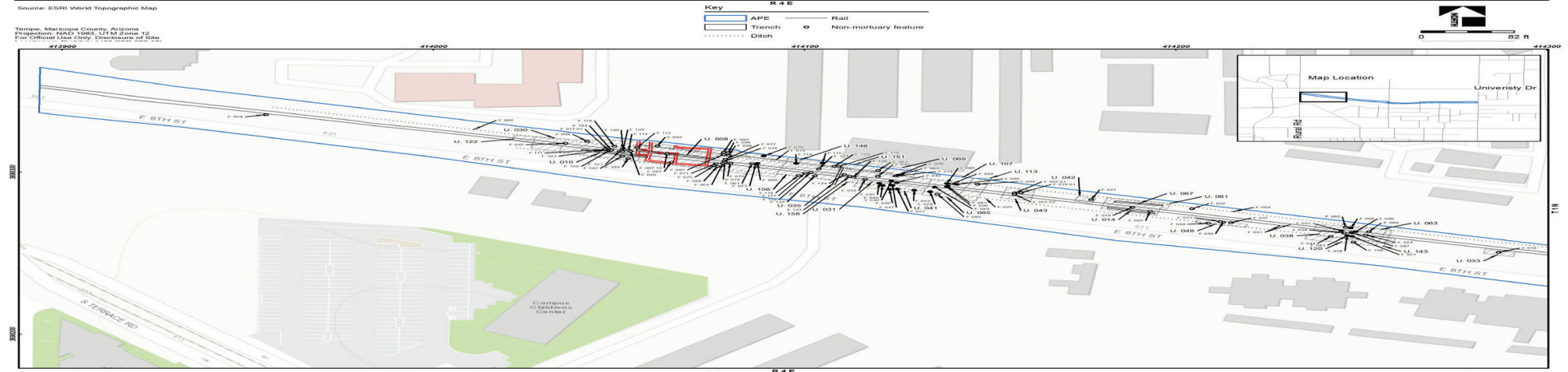
- 2010 – Preliminary Design Complete

- 2014/15 – 3 Rounds of Public Meetings
- 2016 – Environmental Data Testing
- 2016/18 – Additional Consultation
- 2018 – Hire new Environmental Consultant
- 2019/22 – Data Recovery and Analysis

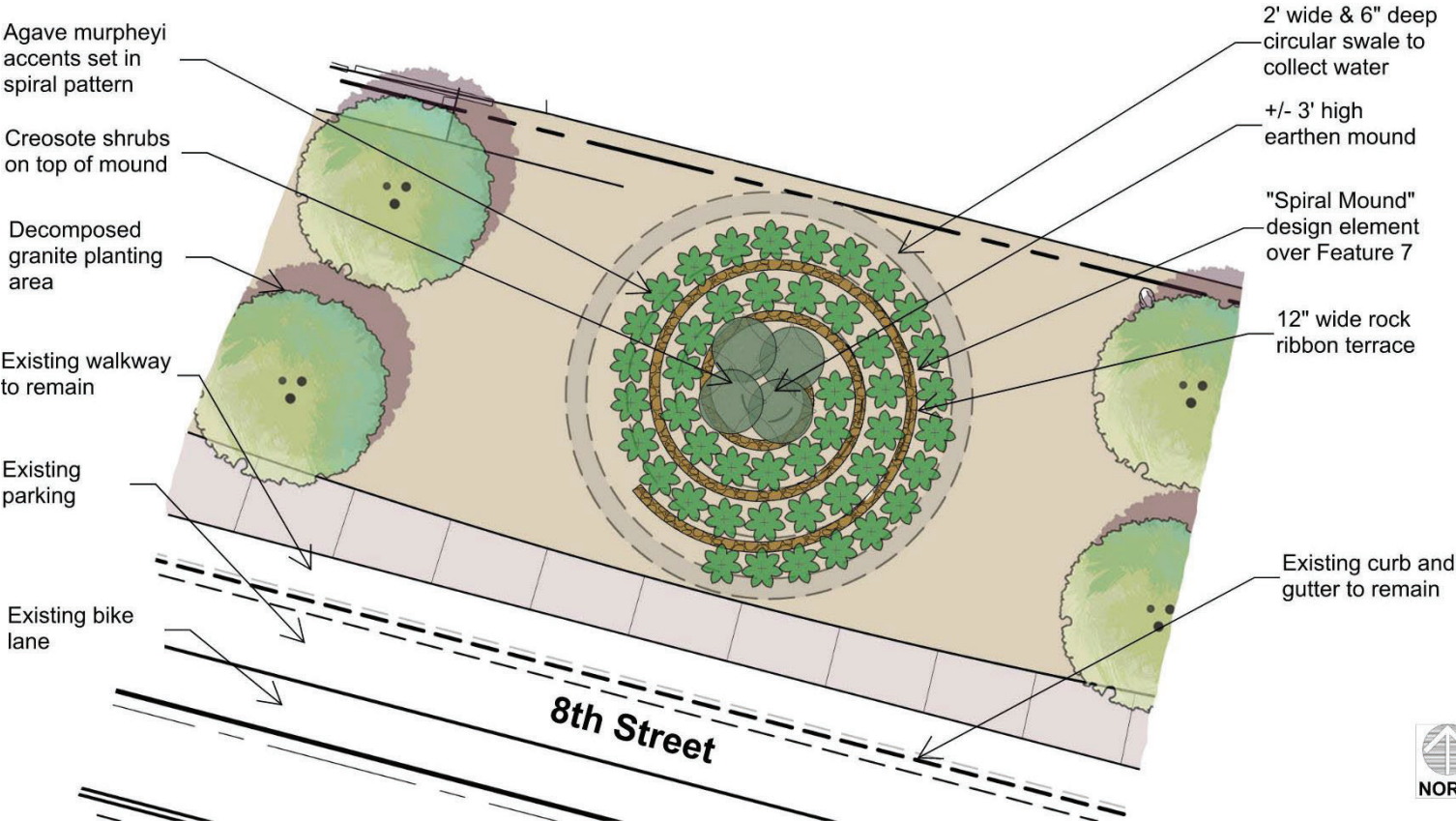

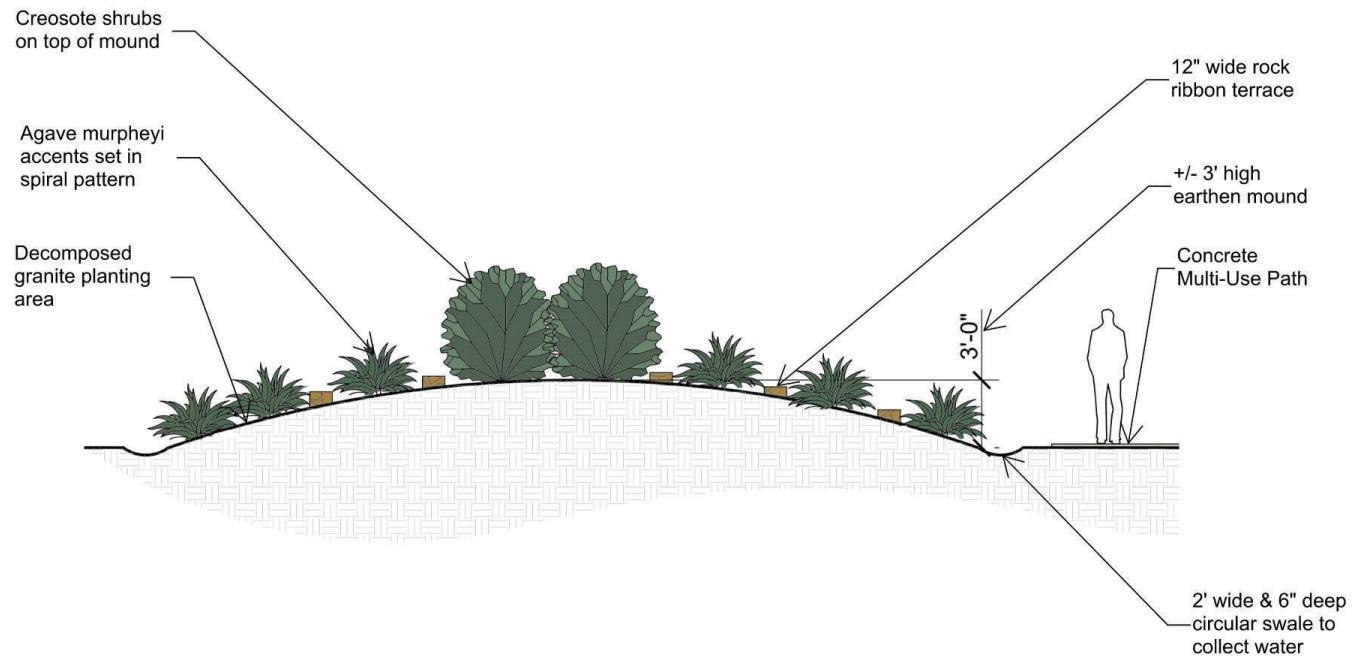

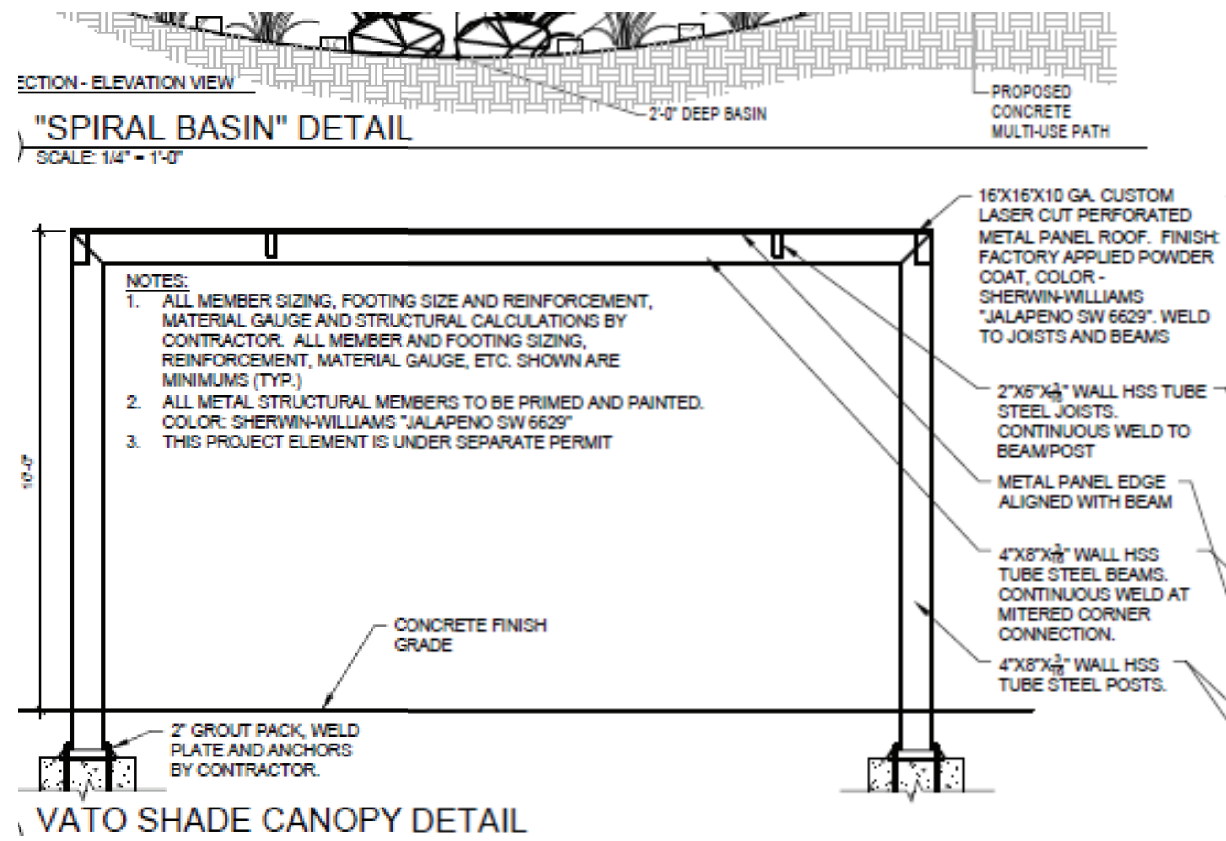

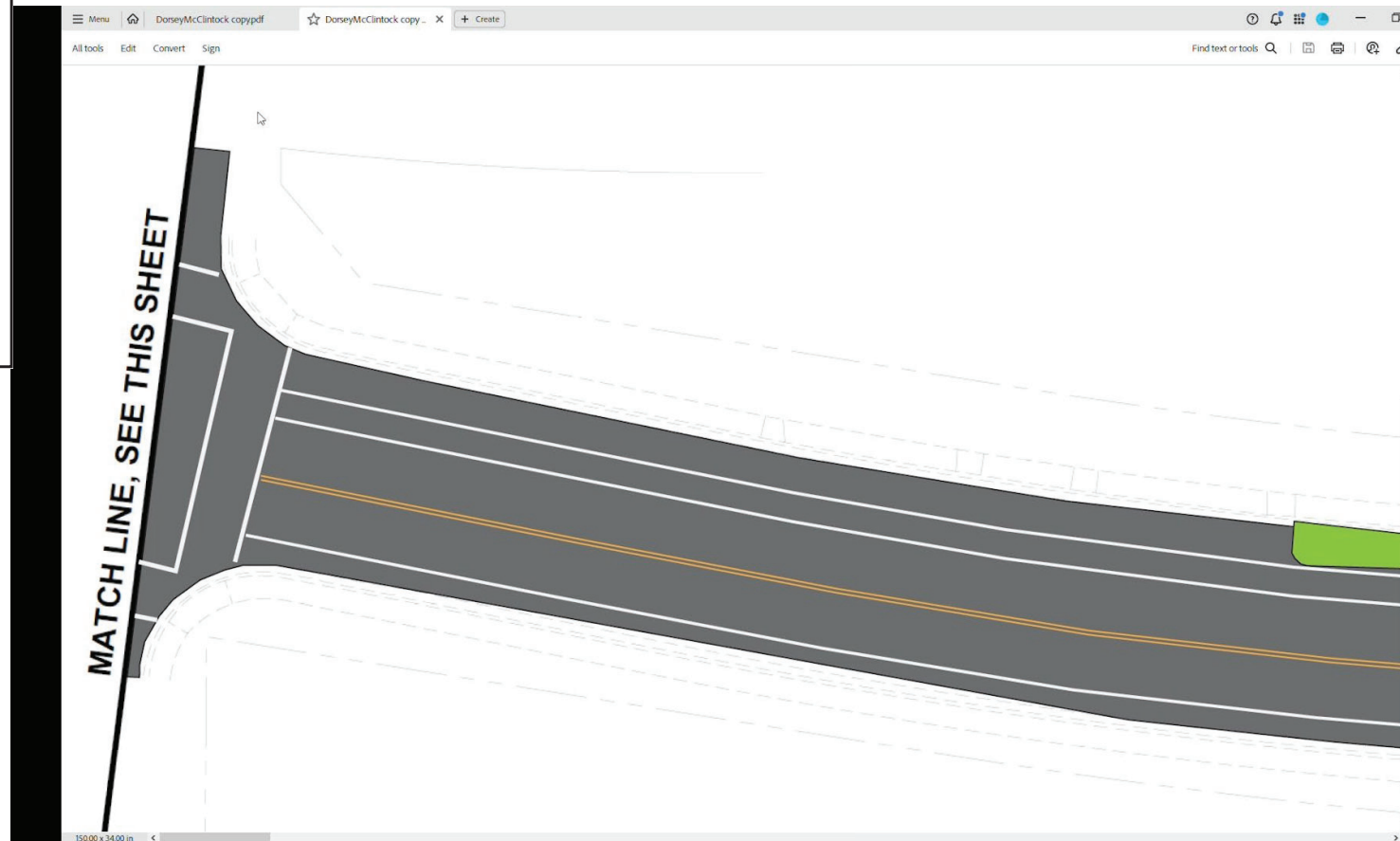
