Agenda Item 2 – Elect a Chairperson Pro Tem

Agenda Item 3 – Approval of Meeting Minutes

August 16, 2023

Motion by Gerardo Lopez to approve the meeting minutes of August 16, 2023, as submitted; seconded by Sharon Doyle. Motion passed on a 6-0 vote.

Agenda Item 4 – Awareness Benches/Memorials/Suicide Prevention

Heather Tibbet and Jay Albertson provided information and awareness about suicide awareness benches and sponsorship.

- Partnership with non-profit Josh's Benches; provides awareness benches
- Benches are sponsored; almost 200 benches nationwide in 20 states
- Awareness of 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline
- Currently none in Arizona; would like to recruit ASU, U of A, parks; parks are places people turn to
- Arizona Department of Health Suicide Prevention Plan
- Process of getting bench: get approval to have bench in a location, she will get sponsors, couple months manufacture bench, facility's manager installs bench
- Currently no policy in place in City for awareness benches
- Board members asked questions and made comments about:
 - Expressed willingness to help
 - Put on future agenda to help develop policy; provide board examples of how to help develop policy

Agenda Item 5 – Mill Ave. Streetscape – University Dr. to Rio Salado Parkway Project

Shelly Seyler, Interim Engineering and Transportation Director from City of Tempe, provided a PowerPoint presentation and information about Mill Avenue Streetscape project that goes from Rio Salado Parkway to University Drive.

- Project Schedule & Brief Overview
 - 40 year infrastructure needing to be replaced, including electrical and irrigation
 - Refresh area
 - \circ Public input was received through August 31, 2023
 - Final engineering design expected February 2024 and construction starting shortly after
 - Wants project to reflect Tempe's art, culture, history
 - Hardscape/Sidewalk Concepts
 - Three concepts
 - Concept 1: salvage as much of brick as possible, incorporate new brick, lithocrete accents (meant to recognize river and Tempe Town Lake), lithomosaics

- Concept 2: reflects what exists today, salvage brick, new brick, ends of streets concrete unit pavers (ties into 5th Street streetscape project), opportunities at end of blocks for artwork
- Concept 3: salvaged brick and concrete unit pavers, artwork at end of blocks
- Incorporate Silva Cell Systems; help trees get water, stay healthy and live longer
- Street Tree Concepts
 - Ficus tree primarily seen on Mill Ave. currently
 - Tipu, Ghost Gum, Fruitless Olive, Mastic
 - Concept 1: Primary 50% Ficus, 50% Tipu; Median/Accent Ghost Gum, Mastic
 - Concept 2: Primary 70% Ficus; Secondary 30% Tipu; Median/Accent Ghost Gum, Fruitless Olive
 - Takeaways: new tree options more resilient, drought tolerant, climate appropriate; retain lesser percentage of Ficus but maintain historic character
- Board members asked questions and made comments about:
 - All three hardscape concepts incorporate salvaged brick
 - Concern expressed about possibility of trees covering up historic buildings, preserving "historic core"
 - o Liking river design
 - Using less dense trees
 - More trees offer benefits other than just shade

Agenda Item 6 – Water Conservation/Turf Reduction

Presentation and information provided by Alex Jovanovic on behalf of Water Utilities.

- WIFA grant; \$107,000 water conservation grant and rebate funds
- 27,600 square feet of non-functional turf to be removed from parks
 - Examples: Creamery Park in process, Goodwin Park upcoming, Dwight Park complete
- 25% cost match requirement by City
- Save water, reduce costs, introduce more habitat and pollinator plants
- City looking to apply for future grants; approximately \$500,000 and 157,000 square feet
 - City Hall 5th Street Streetscape, Kiwanis North, Fiesta and Ruben Romero, Rio Salado Park, Campbell, Mary & Moses Green, Michelle Brooks-Totress
- Waterfluence: data driven water conservation
- Board members asked questions and made comments about:
 - How were areas identified for removal of non-functional turf?
 - o Do residents have access to Waterfluence?
 - Great program for residents
