State law prohibits municipalities from using resources, including equipment, employee time, and facilities, to influence an election. Government-sponsored forums must be impartial and for purely informational purposes. City of Tempe-hosted forums are purely informational and provide an equal opportunity to all candidates' viewpoints.

#### General Plan 2050 "For" or "Against" Argument Filing Process

The deadline for people to file arguments in favor of or in opposition of the <u>General Plan 2050</u> is **5:00 p.m. next Wednesday, December 13**. To date, no arguments have been filed. Arguments will be included in the publicity pamphlet, which is mailed to each Tempe household containing a registered voter beginning February 6. #### Monday, March 4

On August 17, 2023, staff from the city, DTA and Wood Solutions group presented on the Downtown Tempe Curb Lane Management Study. As identified in the presentation, one of the immediate strategies for moving forward was to initiate a 6–12-month technology pilot to determine the effectiveness of data gathering, monitoring and operational enhancements.

The Downtown Tempe Authority (DTA) and city staff have been working with technology companies who can assist with the pilot and DTA will be entering into an agreement with Cleverciti to implement the pilot test on Mill Avenue and College Avenue. Below is a picture of the device that will be used in the pilot.

Evaluate technology enhancements to support enhanced curb management:

- Pilot tests to determine effectiveness of data gathering, monitoring, and operational enhancements
- Evaluate opportunities to interface with other

- Evaluate opportunities for demand-driven management and operational practices
- Redefine locations along Mill Avenue as part of streetscape enhancements
