- Testify in court, at hearings, defense interviews and depositions.
- Conduct training or presentations related to the forensic science discipline.
- Ensure scene safety and evidence integrity.
- Operate and maintain assigned equipment, supplies and laboratory equipment.
- Prepare and conduct quality control testing on reagents and supplies and conduct validation tests for new techniques and reagents.
- Perform related duties as assigned.

Machinery: bucket truck, riding mowers, backhoe etc.

Hand Tools: hammers, wrenches, shovels, wheel barrels, saws etc.

Personal Protective Equipment: respirators, Tyvek coveralls, hard hats, fall protection harness etc.
