

Project description

Our vision is to create a series of 10 murals on private walls along the historic George Ditch which serves as a pathway bisecting our neighborhood. The plan is to hold a weekend long event where artists and neighbors collaborate to paint murals during an event that also includes live music and food. The neighborhood is seeking the Maryanne Corder Neighborhood Grant for artist fees and materials, homeowner contributions will fund entertainment and food related to the event.



We hope to include a QR code for each artist that would link to their Venmo so that they could receive additional donations in the same way our musicians receive tips during our Ditch Music concerts. This logo will ne used to promote the event.

Ability

Neighborhood representatives attended the Oak Street Alley Mural Festival Phoenix during their latest event in March to get a feel for how their event works and later had a conversation with organizers. While much larger in scale than our event, it was informative and great to see the energy that can be created with murals.





Our next step in the project, if funded, will be to match the artists with the homeowners (Aug.-Sept.). The event to paint the murals is tentatively planned for the weekend of Oct. 18-20, 2024.

All murals will be on private walls and the responsibility of the homeowner to maintain. We anticipate asking artists that participate to provide minor touch ups for the first year.

The University Park neighborhood has a long history of community involvement including:

- Tree planting and on-going maintenance of trees and landscaping along the Ditch and at the street closure planter at the far west end.
- Ditch Music series started during COVID in 2020
- Participation in Neighborhood Olympics since inception 11 years ago
- Participation in the Neighborhood Grant to turn former abandoned parking lot at Daley Park into a community space with cornhole boards, fruit trees, a bocce court, and shade structure in conjunction with the City of Tempe and surrounding neighborhoods.
- Standpipe enhancement projects
- A regular schedule of neighborhood meetings to update neighbors on city issues and seek input on projects.

This grant project is the result of numerous neighborhood meetings, mailings, emails, and hand-delivered fliers. The meetings were well-attended and the details of how this project would take place were a result of the discussions. All neighbors were invited to participate including those not bordering on the Ditch. See Appendix A.

We seek two specific outcomes with this grant:

- To hold a community building event that involves neighbors in the work of priming and painting the murals and provides an opportunity to gather, listen to music, and share in sense of community created by working together towards a common good.
- 2. To enhance the primary walking path through our neighborhood with art. We believe that murals will further enhance our sense of identity and be a source of pride for everyone in the neighborhood.

University Park Residents:

We are meeting on Monday to talk about MURALS on residents' walls that face the ditch. (potentially other walls, but let's see how this goes first)

When: Monday I I/20 at 5:30

Where: University Lutheran, 340 E. 15th

Goal is to get a count of residents interested in murals to be painted on the walls facing the ditch. Also to talk through some questions we have, ideas we have and any issues or concerns people might have.

The rough idea is to apply for a grant to put 10-20 murals up along the ditch with some monetary contribution from each mural location resident/owner and potentially some other small monetary help from any neighbor that would like to help. (example: we don't live on the ditch, but we'd throw a few bucks in to help do this project on the ditch) BUT, the main idea is to use grant funding for the vast majority of it.

We would have to apply by the April-ish of this year, hopefully, be awarded in the summer, and do the project in Fall of 2024.

The vision for the project day(s) would be for artists to start on a Friday with some limited neighborhood help with labor, have music that eve, then the murals are completed the next day and have a coffee/food truck or something there during the day.

Nothing is cut in stone, so please attend the meeting or email me or Laura with your interest or questions.

At our last neighborhood meeting it was agreed that we would look into exploring a neighborhood grant to paint murals on people's walls that are along our canal. Well, we met with a couple artists to think through how this might work and now want to discuss how we might move forward with the project with all of you.

The basics:

- . Murals would be open to anyone along the canal that is interested in having an artist design a mural for their back wall
- . Homeowners will be asked to contribute a portion of the cost (amount to be determined)
- · Painting would take place as part of a neighborhood celebration—possibly with music and a potluck
- · Total grant amount potentially available for the project is \$20,000
- . If we are awarded grant, project would take place in the fall of 2024

The November meeting was well attended and even neighbors not facing the Ditch agreed that the project was worth pursuing. A participation fee of \$100 was agreed upon to fund activities related to the event that the grant would not cover.

The **University Park Neighborhood** is seeking muralists to participate in a project to create a series of murals on private walls along the George Ditch in Tempe. University Park is a small neighborhood on 13th, 14th and 15th Streets east of Mill Avenue and west of McAllister Street. The neighborhood is bisected by George Ditch, a historic irrigation canal that also serves as a walking connection. The Ditch is the community center of our neighborhood and has been improved over the years with grants to plant shade trees and paint the irrigation standpipes along its banks. The Ditch also serves as the location for Ditchmusic, Friday night concerts featuring local musicians, as well as Ditchmas, an annual holiday event with music, luminarias along the Ditch, and a potluck. George Ditch is also home to our 'art bridge,' a footbridge over the canal that serves as a collecting point for anyone wishing to add to it.


