Upon the establishment of a quorum, meeting was called to order at 4:35 p.m. by Lane Waddell.

Agenda Item 1 - Public Appearances

Agenda Item 2 – Approval of Meeting Minutes

May 15, 2024

Motion by Shereen Lerner to postpone the approval of meeting minutes to August 21, 2024, in order to provide answers to the questions. Lane Waddell seconded. Motion passed on a 3-0 vote. Ayes: Chair Lane Waddell and Board members, Thomas Klabunde, and Shereen Lerner. Absent: Vice Chair Susan Carlson, Chair Mary Farmer

Agenda Item 3 - Grass Clippings

Alex Jovanovic also was able to provide context and answer questions related to the driving range, hole 2, and various other topics.

Regarding Drive Range & Hole #2:

- Board members asked questions and made comments about:
 - What is the acreage of the courses compared to Rolling Hills? Would have to do further research, will be provided at future meetings.
 - How many courses are municipal? What constitutes a municipal course from municipal golf? Further research required.
 - Does the course need full flight balls? This is an operational decision.
 - o Concerns about construction and when Tempeans can play at a lower rate.
 - Monday Wednesday closed until 4pm; course should be fully reopened in November.
 - Are there Tempe rates at night golf? No.
 - Women's League Concerns/Requests
 - Safety issues
 - Rocks on side; requesting pavers for a smooth path.
 - When turf was removed, rocks were left scattered; suggesting for the rocks to be scraped off. There are specific holes listed in the letter.
 - Requesting that the Hole 9 tee box be put south of whites.
 - Continuity of the overall goal of "safety"
 - Zoo health/safety solved; Women's League safety issue is not.
 - What is the City's stance on Hole 2 and the Driving Range? City not necessarily supportive of the loss of yardage on hole 2 for a bigger range; hoping for a win-win situation.
 - Members are still overall opposed to Hole #2 and its reduction in yards for the lengthening of the Driving Range.
 - Questions that need answering:
 - Cost of moving nets: Higher nets? Repurposing? Grass Clippings working on estimates/quotes.
 - Less cost for repurposing. There is not a full design team, Grass Clippings does not want to incur cost of a golf architect ahead of approval from the City.
 - Breakdown of costs; residents of Tempe vs non-residents
 - Breakdown of rounds played, residents vs non-residents.
 - City's stance on recommendations for driving range and hole 2? Looking to the subcommittee for a decision on proposal or compromise.

<u>Agenda Item 5 – Future Agenda Items</u>
The board members proposed for the driving range and hole 2 to remain on the next agenda. Grass Clippings will be in attendance for the full board meeting in August. Lastly, the board members wanted to agendize the carry on hole 9 & association concerns soon after.
