Upon the establishment of a quorum, meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Susan Carlson. Susan welcome new board member Cory Pechtl and congratulated Sharon Doyle for receiving 2024 Don Carlos Humanitarian award.

Agenda Item 1 - Public Appearances

None.

Agenda Item 2 – Approval of Meeting Minutes

June 26, 2024

Motion by Thomas Klabunde to approve the meeting minutes of June 26, 2024. Seconded by Lane Waddell. Motion passed on a 9-0 vote.

Ayes: Chair Susan Carlson, Vice Chair Elizabeth Hatch, board members Sharon Doyle, Mary Farmer, Thomas Klabunde, Shereen Lerner, Cory Pechtl, Lane Waddell, and Lisa Zyriek.

Absent: Gerardo Lopez and Regina Ponder. Gerardo Lopez arrived after the vote.

Agenda Item 3 - Dementia & Age Friendly Park

Susan discussed putting to a vote the concept of Dementia & Age Friendly Park that was presented at the last meeting.

Motion by Shereen Lerner to approve. Seconded by Lane Waddell. Motion passed on a 10-0 vote. Ayes: Chair Susan Carlson, Vice Chair Elizabeth Hatch, board members Sharon Doyle, Mary Farmer, Thomas Klabunde, Shereen Lerner, Gerardo Lopez, Cory Pechtl, Lane Waddell, and Lisa Zyriek. Absent: Regina Ponder.

Agenda Item 4 - Golf

Jake Hoselton from Grass Clippings Rolling Hills provided an update on various items and projects.

- Rounds of golf from 7/1/23-6/30/24: Resident 3,106, Non-Resident 44,692, Day 26,889, Night 19,609; night golf started 12/1/23; year before Grass Clippings had about 55,000 rounds total
- Construction updates: patio, event lawn, outdoor bar, parking lot expansion set to deliver 11/1/24; driving range, covered hitting bays, misters, tracer technology set to deliver 10/1/24; restaurant interior set to deliver 3/1/25; grand opening for everything after 3/1/25
- Construction golf course: Holes 1 and 9 par 4 tee boxes restored 11/1/24; pending plans to
 extend driving range, reangle Hole 2; plans to add tee boxes or expand square footage across
 course, keep hole integrity; three specific zones that are eyesores; formerly grass, now dirt;
 wanting to work with City of Tempe to restore
- Overseeding entire month of October; in future aim for three-week overseeding period
- Professional golf event 12/5 and 12/6, expected to be broadcasted on professional network
- Club championship 9/13 and 9/14; night golf on 9/13, day golf on 9/14
- Advertising Tempe resident discounts in pro shop; want to work with City of Tempe to use
 outlets to incorporate more marketing and communication; marketing using Tempe outlets can
 be competitive; will talk to Communication and Marketing about options
- Board members asked questions and made comments about:
 - Huge difference between resident and non-resident golf rounds played
 - People make their decision about where they're going to play before they leave the house; not enough to just post resident rates in pro shop
 - Resident rate is not easy to find; have to look in FAQs; can rate be posted on main page or included in newsletter
 - o How do current number of rounds played compare to when Tempe oversaw course?

- Agreement says \$35 for resident 9/1-5/31 during week, not at night; summertime \$20
- o Can we find out what deadline is to submit something monthly to market with Tempe?

Agenda Item 5 - Mill Ave.

Eric Iwersen from Transportation and Sustainability provided construction updates on projects around Mill Avenue and downtown Tempe.

- Sidewalk and ADA improvements, expanded pedestrian space, new sidewalk pavers, historic markers, electrical and irrigation upgrades, new bus shelters, new trees
- LithoMosaics celebrating Tempe history being installed on a lot of corners, similar to what is at Clark Park Community Center and Pool; worked with Community Services, Museum, Historic Preservation Commission on recommended images; newer but expect to last a long time
- A lot of ficus have died, will keep healthy ones and replace others; all ficus will eventually be replaced; new trees do better with higher temperatures
- Phase 1 of Mill Ave. and University Dr. intersection complete; widening some sidewalks
- Timeline for completion unknown but thinking another 1.5 years; looking at ways to shorten
- Deeper planting wells and new designs to capture more water
- Board members asked questions and made comments about:
 - Are all ficus trees being taken out and replaced?
 - o Are the LithoMosaic images?
 - o Will new trees do well with higher temperatures at night?
 - Were you able to incorporate Rain to Roots?
 - Expected life on LithoMosaic or concern about expected life?

Agenda Item 6 – Monarch Butterfly

Evelyn Brumfield from Sustainability and Resilience discussed the Mayor's Monarch proclamation and Rain to Roots.

- Mayor's Monarch Pledge is an international program put on by National Wildlife Federation;
 collection of cities and town who have agreed to promote pollinators to support Monarchs
- Rain to Roots is name for green stormwater infrastructure; harvest rainwater; turn hardscapes into sponges; conversations are happening with golf courses
- Website is being updated to provide information and resources about pollinator plants; Rain to Roots Ambassador meetings happen monthly
- Working on integrating Sustainability staff into meetings and conversations; working on refreshing landscapes; want to promote and incorporate more native plants
- Board members asked questions and made comments about:
 - There may be an opportunity to work with golf courses
 - o Do you have Rain to Roots handouts?
 - o Have you thought about communicating with Development Review Commission?
 - o Are you looking at putting native plants along pathways?

Agenda Item 7 – Arts in the Parks

Maja Aurora from Arts & Culture discussed the Arts in the Parks program and upcoming events.

- Community Arts based out of Edna Arts Vihel Center, also do community-based and schoolbased programs, grant funder of programs and teachers
- Arts in the Parks are free, hyper-local events in neighborhood parks; going to 10 different parks in next year; invite neighbors who live near park; send out mailers, yard and banner signs in park, communication to local schools; live music, food trucks, interactive art activities; work with Neighborhood Services to communicate with HOAs and local contacts
- When picking parks consider demographics and target all areas of City, accessibility, construction projects, dates to coordinate with other departments, schools and neighborhoods
- Arts & Culture Master Plan had comments about South Tempe feeling disconnected and wanting more accessibility to Arts & Culture; Equity Study helped identify parks
- Use Request for Proposal process for selecting artists; evals to select themes
- September 16 Grand Re-Opening for Creamery Park; Maja's team is involved
- Board members asked questions and made comments about:
 - Do you communicate with HOAs?
 - It looks like a lot of Arts in the Park events are in the south; how did you decide?

Agenda Item 8 - Park Rule Change

Alex Jovanovic discussed recent park rule change prohibiting smoking at some parks.

- City Code allows Community Services Director has ability to add prohibited activities
- Parks considered based on density, proximity to schools, shared facilities with schools
- Can be considered pilot and in future plan to go to Mayor and Council to update City Code to apply across entire park system; would be public process that allows for public input
- Enforcement will be education through September 1; still advocate for education after, but will consider other levels of enforcement, if needed; enforcement is within boundaries of park
- Language in rule allows for Community Services Director to allow smoking at events that want to allow smoking; designated spaces that allow smoking are considered
- Board members asked questions and made comments about:
 - o Is this considered a pilot project? How will it be monitored and enforced?
 - Focused on area that is developed in park and not a grass area?
 - Concern about ability to really be able to enforce, especially when thousands of people
 - Most effective way to enforce is to communicate how smoking affects others
 - Parks identified are not ones next to high schools; should consider adding

Agenda Item 9 - Future Agenda Items

Board discussed possible items to consider for future meetings.

- Have Shereen provide update on Desert Conservation Commission
- Thomas would like to follow up on Monarch-related projects across parks
- Would like to know about status of the vacant Tennis Coordinator position; Alex informed board Dan Bratetic has filled the vacant position; would like to discuss all of tennis and not just tennis at Kiwanis Recreation Center and would like to have Dan present to the board
