## Fall Event Planning Underway:

- Halloween Stroll, Sunday, October 27 from 12 noon 5 pm. Costume contest sponsored by AZ Theatre Co. in Ragsdale Park, pumpkin patch, children's games/crafts and trick-or-treating at downtown merchants.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Sundays on Mill, 10 am 3 pm on Nov. 10, Jan.12, Feb 9 and April 13 (Dec & March fall on art festival weekends). The streetcar will not be running during the event this year, enabling more vendors and activities on both side of Mill Avenue. New this year: a barber battle/tournament that culminates in a championship bout at the 2025 Juneteenth Block Party.
- Fantasy of Lights Street Parade + Tree Lighting, Friday, November 29. Registration is open for parade units

- 56th Annual 2024 Fall Tempe Festival of the Arts, December 6-8. We've received almost 700 artist applications, and the jury will whittle them down to 350 or 360 invited artists in the next few weeks. The Spring festival will be the 48th annual.
- Menorah Lighting in Ragsdale Park in December; date to be determined because the first night of Hanukkah is December 25; working with Rabbis on best timing.
- Food/snack/beverage vendor applications now open for parades and art festival. Sponsorship opportunities are available, as are volunteer opportunities for corporations, groups and individuals.

## Mill Avenue Streetscape

- Festoon lighting on 4th & 6th Streets is complete not only looks great but provides a feeling of safety
- Streetscape project is finished at the University & Mill intersection and now the project will be moving north and working on both the east and west side of the street between university & 7<sup>th</sup> Street starting August 26.
   Project status online merchant meetings will be held at 2 pm on Sept. 10, Oct. 8, Nov. 12 & Dec. 10. Details can be found on the COT downtown Tempe refresh webpage.

## **Downtown Tempe Façade Improvement Grants**

With funding from the City of Tempe Economic Development office, you can start to see projects underway as a result of the grant: Slickables Ice Cream Sandwiches at the Brickyard has a brand-new patio enclosure; the Casa Loma Building is being repainted, doors replaced and new awnings up soon; the 414 S. Mill building painted their metal roof and repaired/painted window frames/doorways. Just under \$300K of total improvements have been submitted – a façade refresh to go with the new streetscape refresh.

## ShopLocal2Win Campaign

To assist merchants in the slower summer season and to help mitigate the challenges of the streetscape project, DTA launched the ShopLocal2Win campaign to drive feet to the downtown merchants. Customers that spend at least \$15 can upload their receipt to <a href="https://lovedowntowntempe2win.com/">https://lovedowntowntempe2win.com/</a> for a chance to win \$500 for themselves as well as \$500 for the business on the receipt. The campaign runs through the end of September with prize drawings every 2 weeks — the first one is later this afternoon! People can also enter the contest by writing a positive review for the business (so no purchase required).

#### Transportation Management Association (TMA)

TMA is a Transportation Management Association (TMA) is an organized group that uses Transportation Demand Management strategies to help the movement of people and goods in an area (alternatives to driving alone in cars). DTA is working with ASU and the City of Tempe to develop the state's first Transportation Management Association and a preliminary budget is in development. The scooter corrals downtown was developed out of this. TMAs vary in size, organization, membership, and services offered,

ASU continues to work on the McCain facility. ASU hired Global Projects to help with content development, public amenities, and presentation space. There will be some outreach meetings coming soon. In the process of getting an architect on board. Novus has several new restaurants opening which are Over Easy, Blue Shushi Sake Grill, Flower Child, Blanco Cocina Cantina, and the North Catelli. The Urban Park space and Transwestern are under construction and are planned to be open in the fall 2025 and fall of 2026.

## Agenda Item 9 – Transportation Updates – Eric Iwersen and Shelly Seyler

Mill avenue is under construction at university. On the eastern side of the Rio Salado near Smith Street, the streetscape project will run down McClintock to Apache and back to downtown Tempe. There will be new protected bike lanes, transit shelters, and bus stops, including trees, water harvesting, and an overall new streetscape design. There is new funding for a refresh of Indian Bend Wash to town lake north to McKellips Rd. The refresh will include trees, lighting, concrete work in coordination with Parks and other department to refresh that pathway. Transportation is also working towards creating about 60 new more new corrals for scooters. On the public transit side there are four new bus shelter designs and are starting to be implemented around the city. A new study has started about extending the streetcar project out to Mesa up to Dobson on Rio Salado Parkway then turn south on Dobson to Main (Apache) and back to downtown Tempe. There was new funding granted for this study and project, up to about 16 million dollars. There will be public meetings starting soon and hoping to have this go to Council in January 2025.

#### Agenda Item 10 - Public and Private Development Update - Ryan Levesque and Mike Baxley

Pier project is still under construction as well as the Southbank Pier, lot 5 and lot 6. Another project along the lake on east side is on hold until the financial markets get better. There are new restaurants coming to Tempe Town Lake, such as, the 333 Restaurant at the Watermark that recently opened. There is the Cora restaurant that is an addition to Watermark facing the lake and still in plan review is the Roman restaurant.

Silo just received their temporary certificate of occupancy. Silo is located at Hayden Ferry Lakeside and will be opening soon.

Community Services Special Events is working ASU on a new design for the boat house this fall. Should have an update in October.

Next meeting Oct.15, 2024. There will be the 4th quarter meeting and following immediately the annual meeting.
