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Arizona Water Sustainability Blue-Ribbon Panel

Arizona Governor Jan Brewer has announced formation of a blue-ribbon panel on water sustainability. The panel consists of Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) and Arizona Department of Water Resources (ADWR) directors and an Arizona Corporation Commission (ACC) Chairman. The goal of the panel is to direct a statewide effort to boost water sustainability through increased conservation and recycling. Among the ideas being considered are; the important of water efficient technologies and practices, the need to recognize the water/energy nexus, conservation incentives, and assistance from Water Infrastructure Finance Authority of Arizona (WIFA).

Chemical Management Reform Proposed by EPA

EPA Administrator Lisa Jackson announce core principals that outline goals for legislative reform of the country's chemical management law, the 1976 Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA). EPA has identified an initial list of chemicals for possible risk management action and anticipates completing and posting action plans in December. TSCA chemicals include such products as polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) and the regulation of asbestos, indoor radon, and lead-based paint exposure.

Now you can use a waste transporter web site hosd by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources to check on licensed hazardous waste transporters. The site lets you check on the transporter's EPA identification number and find information such as contact and phone number, and find which waste the company can transport.
