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SPCC Compliance Date Extension

CFR Citation: 40 CFR 112

On July 28, 2010, EPA amended the Spill Prevention Control, and Countermeasures (SPCC) rule. The amendments completed the SPCC action proposed on October 15, 2007 (72 FR 58378), finalized on December 5, 2008 (73 FR 74236), and for which the Agency considered public comments again in February 2009 (74 FR 5900, February 3, 2009). However, EPA recognizes that because of the changes in this action, and specifically provisions that have been removed from the December 2008 Amendments, facilities may need additional time to comply with the SPCC amendments. Because of the uncertainty surrounding the final amendments to the December 5, 2008, rule and the delay of the effective date, the Agency has extended the compliance date to November 10, 2010.

City of Tempe Ordinance Changes to Two Programs

The City has passed ordinance changes that impact to two Tempe programs:

Permit requirements for Pool discharges: Permits are not required if size qualifications are met, however de-chlorination and other requirements must be met. Dischargers are responsible for ensuring that flooding or hazards are not created by discharge.

Amendments to City Code Relating to Dust Control: In response to SB1552 the city has amended code to control particulate emissions related to leaf blowing, open fires, vacant lots and unpaved roads. Changes are effective August 1, 2010;
