It's that time of year we've all been waiting for, when we get to enjoy Tempe's annual PlayDay! This free community event invites all ages to celebrate play and reap the benefits of being active from 10 a.m.–2 p.m. on Saturday, Feb. 27 at Kiwanis Park, Baseline Rd. and Mill Ave. The City is hosting the celebration in keeping with its designation as a Playful City USA community for the seventh consecutive year.

Participants of PlayDay will have the opportunity to join a variety of structured and unstructured games and events, including: youth sports activities, dance & movement activities, inflatables, program demonstrations and more!

Diablo Dash, sponsored by the Tempe Diablos will return to this year's PlayDay. Run, crawl, slide, climb, and laugh all the way to the finish line with a free, family-friendly obstacle course.

Participate in the Kid Zone Experience representative of the Kid Zone Enrichment Program. Participants will have the opportunity to compete in speed stacking, a salsa making challenge, chess tournament, STEM experiments, and more!

Visitors will also have the chance to participate in the 25th annual Just for Kids Fishing Expo. This is the first year City of Tempe has partnered with Anglers United and Arizona Game and Fish to bring the fishing expo to PlayDay. Anglers of all ages are welcomed to try their hand at fishing on the west side of Kiwanis Lake between 8 a.m.–2 p.m. Equipment will be provided for use at no cost, during the event. Fishing licenses are not required during the expo.

KaBOOM!, a national non-profit organization dedicated to promoting play in children's lives, chose Tempe as a Playful City USA community. In the eighth year of the program, KaBOOM! named 241 cities and towns across the country — 14 of which are in Arizona — as Playful City USA honorees. Tempe was one of 22 communities given this designation for the seventh consecutive year because of the way it uses play and play spaces to positively impact childhood wellness, public safety and quality of life.


SWING INTO SPRING TRAINING AT TEMPE DIABLO STADIUM

Fans can park and get a free ride to the stadium with the return of the **Spring Training Trollies.** Game attendees are encouraged to park at one of four Downtown Tempe Park-It locations, board the trolley and let someone else do the driving. The trolley will circulate between the Mill Avenue District and Tempe Diablo Stadium every 20 minutes beginning two hours before game time, until 30 minutes after the game ends on all home game days. Taking the Spring Training Trolley also allows fans to spend time in the Mill Avenue District before and after the game. Instead of sitting in event traffic, spend your time enjoying a nice lunch, dinner, drinks or even some shopping at more than 100 restaurants, bars and shops. The trolley stop is located at 5th St. and Mill Ave., within two blocks from the Mill Avenue Light Rail Station.



organic material by collecting it citywide and turning it into nutrient-rich compost that is returned to the community. For more info, visit www.tempe.gov/slashthetrash.




TEMPE HISTORY MUSEUM CELEBRATES BLACK HISTORY MONTH

Join the <u>Tempe History Museum</u> throughout February as it celebrates Black History Month with a variety of guest presenters, musical performances and fine art.

Tempe History Museum's African American Advisory Committee will host a celebration from 4–6 p.m. on Saturday, Feb. 13. The special program provides a look back at the distinct music and fashion of the black community from the 1930's thru the 1970's. Admission is free. Light refreshments will be served. At 7 p.m. on Saturday, Feb. 27 the Driftwood Quintet, a Tempe-based reed quintet, will perform. Their instruments include oboe, English horn, clarinets, saxophones, bassoon and bass clarinet. In honor of Black History Month, Driftwood Quintet will feature pieces from little-known Black composers. Admission is free.

Throughout the month of February, stop by the Community Room at the Tempe History Museum to take in the fine art display presented by The Diverse Artist Collective of Arizona. Admission is free.

Bring your appetite and a desire to help others to Tempe Empty Bowls, held from 11 a.m.–2 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 26 and Saturday, Feb. 27. FOOD FOR FINES

The Tempe Public Library's Food for Fines program was a huge success this past holiday season. During November and December, residents donated non-perishable food items at the Tempe Public Library to feed Tempe's hungry and settled their library fines at the same time.

The food drive benefited the Tempe Community Action Agency (TCAA), a non-profit organization that serves the Tempe community. The bins at the Library were stocked, emptied and restocked, reaching a grand total of 8,062 lbs. or approximately 6,718 meals.

The total of library fines waived during the campaign reached an amount of \$11,421. This is the third consecutive year Tempe Public Library has offered the Food for Fines Campaign. Each year, the amount of food and money donated multiplies.

KAJIKAWA SOFTBALL CLASSIC RETURNS TO TEMPE FEB. 11-15

The Arizona State University Women's Softball Team will kick off their 2016 season at home in the annual Kajikawa Classic from Thursday, Feb. 11 through Monday, Feb. 15, 2016 at the Tempe Sports Complex and ASU's Farrington Stadium.

Named after legendary ASU softball coach and Sun Devil athletics founder, Bill Kajikawa, the Kajikawa Classic is an ASU softball tradition. The 2016 Classic will host 31 teams (including ASU) and over 80 games will be played throughout the five-day event. Teams play in round-robin fashion and the winning team is determined by percentage. This year's classic will feature representation from the Pac-12, Mountain West, Big Ten, Big East and more.
