Tempe offers a multitude of green activities for Earth Month

Tempe celebrates Earth Month in a big, green way with a variety of activities ranging from Tempe Bike Month to a Zero-Waste Day and annual Arbor Day 5K that helps replenish Tempe's urban forest and more! Whatever your passion, we have ways for you to get involved in helping the environment and celebrating the Earth during April.

WALK, RUN AND JOIN THE FUN AT TEMPE'S 7TH ANNUAL ARBOR DAY 5K

It's time to dust off your running shoes and get ready to join us at the 7th Annual Arbor Day 5K on Friday, April 29 at Kiwanis Park Mill Ave. and All-America Way.

The Arbor Day 5K is a chip-timed event and begins at 6:15 p.m. The scenic course begins at the Fire Circle on the west side of Kiwanis Lake and winds through the park. All registered 5K participants will receive a commemorative Arbor Day 5K T-shirt. Advance registration is \$20 through April 28 and increases to \$25 on Friday, April 29. Registration will be available on-site the day of the event.

New this year, our partner Arizona 811 will host a free community fun run that is .811 mile. The course makes a single loop around Kiwanis Lake. On-site registration will be available the day of the event. The Arizona 811 Fun Run will begin at 6p.m. All participants will receive a free water bottle.

The Arbor Day 5K event expo, complete with food, games and information opens at 4:30 p.m. Packet pick-up and day-of registration for both the Arbor Day 5K and Arizona 811 Fun Run also start at 4:30 p.m. There will be a tree planting ceremony before the Arizona 811 Fun Run.

The Arbor Day 5K is presented by SRP, Arizona 811 and the City of Tempe. All proceeds benefit the Trees for Tempe program to help revitalize Tempe's urban forest. GET GEARED UP FOR TEMPE BIKE MONTH

To celebrate Tempe Bike Month, the city of Tempe will hold its 20th annual Tour de Tempe community bike ride on April 3 and 24th annual Bike to Work Day on April 20. The purpose of Bike Month is to encourage people to use bicycles as an alternative mode of transportation.



Tour de Tempe

More than 1,000 people are expected to participate in the Tour de Tempe community bike ride on Sunday, April 3 from 7:30–11 a.m. at <u>Kiwanis Park</u>, 6111 S. All-America Way in the west parking lot across from the Kiwanis Batting Range. This free, 10-mile bike ride is led by members of the Tempe City Council. Registration starts at 7:30 a.m. with the ride starting at 9 a.m. Register the day of the event or fill out a registration form online at <u>Tempe.gov/BikeMonth</u>.

Free t-shirts will be available for the first 1,000 riders and helmets are required. Breakfast foods and coffee will be provided. Please bring your own water.

Bike to Work Day

On Wednesday, April 20 from 6:30–8 a.m., all bicycle riders who stop by one of the participating Bike to Work Day locations in Tempe will receive a free breakfast and the first 350 riders will receive free T-shirts. At 7 a.m., join members of the Tempe City Council on a bike ride from Whole Foods Market to NCounter in downtown Tempe.

Following Bikes and Beer, Tempe Bicycle Action Group will lead a group ride from the museum to Pedal Haus Brewery in downtown Tempe.

Recycle-A-Bicycle

The City of Tempe recently launched a Recycle-a-Bicycle pilot program designed to get ridable bicycles into the hands of kids who would not otherwise have one. The goal is to make bike ownership a reality for kids in need and encourage a healthy, active lifestyle and to promote responsibility and safety. As part of the pilot, Tempe will join forces with Gililland Middle School (GMS) during the 2016-17 school year. Students at GMS,

along with a certified teacher, will work with the Tempe Police Department to refurbish the bikes as part of the Community Services elective class offered at GMS.



The City of Tempe invites residents to clean closets, clear-out sheds, eliminate clutter in garages and help the environment by participating in a FREE Zero Waste Day on Saturday, April 16 from 7 a.m.–1 p.m. All items brought to this event at the Tempe Fire Training Facility, 1340 E. University Dr., will be recycled, reused or disposed of in an environmentally safe manner.

All items need to be clean and sanitary. Accepted items include: appliances (dishwashers, refrigerators, stoves), books, building supplies (no cement), electronic technology, equipment, household textiles (clothing, linens, towels), household hazardous waste, plastic shopping bags, shoes, belts, handbags, wallets, soft/stuffed toys, tires and more.

Free secure confidential document shredding will be offered and free compost will be given away to each household that participates in this event. Proof of Tempe residency is required (e.g. driver's license, utility bill). A donation of one canned food item is requested.

Join us from 1–5 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays in April and May.


Admission is \$5 for ages 2–12 years and \$7 for ages 13 years and older.

EVERYTHING WITH WINGS AT FREE ART FRIDAY




