

Minutes Tempe Family Justice Commission August 23, 2016

Minutes for the Tempe Family Justice Commission Meeting held on August 23, 2016 at 6:00 PM at the Tempe Public Library, 2nd Floor Board Room, 3500 South Rural Road Tempe, Arizona 85282.

Item 1 - Meeting called to order at 6:01 PM

Item 4 – Review and Approval of June 28, 2016 Minutes – Motion by Commission Member Beatrice Kastenbaum to approve minutes; second by Commission Member Bill Richardson. Motion passed unanimously.

Item 5 - Chair Remarks

Chair Karyn Lathan welcomed the newest Commission Members Ilene Dode, Andi Fetzner, and Judith Homer. Members introduced themselves to the Commission and the professional categories they represent. Commission Members Angel Carbajal, Beatrice Kastenbaum, and Judith Homer terms are set to expire on December 31, 2016. All Commission Members mentioned are seeking reappointment; their new term expiration date is December 31, 2019.

Chair Karyn Lathan is seeking a new Vice Chair for the Commission; the Commission will vote on a new Vice Chair at the September 20, 2016 meeting.

Item 6 - Social Media Reported Sexual Assault

Chair Karyn Lathan shared a message she received via Facebook:

"My friend was sexually assaulted on her way home from Casey Moore's and the first thing she did was run back to Casey's because she felt safe there and knew the staff. She came up with the idea #TealDeal which would be teaming up with bars and restaurants that would be a safe spot for woman when they feel uncomfortable by a man. The woman could feel comfortable going up to any staff member and telling them what the man had done, is doing, and they would ask him to leave; not just tell them to ignore it or go to the other side of the bar etc. Teal is the color of sexual assault. We have three bars on board and we are gaining momentum fast. We want to host a month long awareness with three or four events at each bar we can get on board. I am going to donate a keg of beer and 100% of proceeds will go to a charity of my friend's choice. We wanted to invite Tempe Police to the event at Casey's because we want to create a sense of community with our Police. Where I grew up, we knew each officer by name; we knew who was patrolling the streets. We want women going to an officer and explaining what happened without being told they were drunk and being made to be the one at fault which recently happened to my friend where she was told she had to pay for her own rape kit. I would love to set up a meeting with the Chief so we can talk about protocol and see if that's something she would be interested in. Is there any way you could hook the two of us up?"

Chair Karyn Lathan suggested she attend a meeting to discuss collaboration between #TealDeal and the Family Justice Commission. Commission Member Angel Carbajal advised the Commission that the Tempe Police Department reached out to community leaders in the neighborhood to explain the incident without violating the victims right to privacy. Commission Member Angel Carbajal further stated he could not discuss specifics of the incident to the Commission. Chair Karyn Lathan asked Commission Member Angel Carbajal if the Police could publish a policy statement and the standard protocol the Police Department follows. Commission Member Angel Carbajal stated anytime there is a sexual assault alleged, Tempe Police will facilitate obtaining a sexual assault examination for the victim and partner with Care 7 adding that Tempe Police is very sensitive in the approach and the type of environment they are creating for the victim. There is no cost to the victim for a sexual assault examination. Nurses conduct the examination, collect the evidence and the results are sent to Tempe Police. Commission Member Bill Richardson suggested publishing the protocols on the Tempe

Police website; the Police Department is currently in the process of publishing policies and procedures on the City website. Commission Member Angel Carbajal contact information will be distributed to the Commission by City Staff.

Item 8 – Commission Appointment Discussion

The City Council approved Commission Member Margaret Tinsley move from an At-Large Member to a Legal Services Provider Member. This move allowed an At-Large position vacancy. The Commission had originally discussed changing the Arizona State University Faculty Member vacancy to an At-Large position however the City Clerk's office is in receipt of an Arizona State University Faculty Member application.

Commission Member Margaret Tinsley filed a motion to withdraw a previous request to the City Council to redesignate the Arizona State University Faculty member position to an At-Large Position; second by Commission Member Bill Richardson. Motion passed unanimously.

Item 9 - City Council Report - November

Deputy Director Valerie Kime-Trujillo reviewed the City Council Report with the Commission. Boards and Commissions have been asked by the City Clerk to prepare and submit an annual report detailing the membership, accomplishments, goals, attendance and the overall work of the City's board and commission volunteers to the City Clerk's office by November 15 of each year. Annual reports shall be coordinated through the chair and approved by the board or commission prior to submittal to the City Clerk. The City Clerk will assemble the reports and provide to the Mayor and Council by January 15 of each year. As requested by the Mayor, board and commission members may present their annual reports to the City Council during scheduled Work Study Sessions; Chair Karyn Lathan and Margaret Tinsley have offered to present the report to the City Council.



What will be our specific, measurable accomplishments for the first year?


