Agenda Item 5 – Youth Town Hall Preparation

1) Mariah Secrest-Comer, Director, Donor Engagement and Communications at Tumbleweed Center for Youth Development, provided a presentation on homeless youth

to inform the MYAC members about their Youth Town Hall discussion topic on homelessness.

- Tumbleweed is the only center that provides extensive services and resources to youth ages 12-25 in Maricopa County.
- Tumbleweed provides resources such as: mobile showers, clothing, food, counseling, art therapy, emergency housing, access to computers, and "Safe Place" locations and pick up at all Valley Metro stops and Quick Trips in Maricopa County.
- Youth become homeless for many reasons including: abuse, neglect, exploitation, domestic disputes, aging-out of foster care, and LGBTQ discrimination.
- Tumbleweed served 199 youth from Tempe in 2016 and there are as many as 600-800 youth who become homeless each year in Maricopa County.
- Tempe youth can help advocate for Tumbleweed and homeless youth by holding clothing and toiletry drives, advocating for LGBTQ acceptance, and letting their peers know about the services Tumbleweed offers.
- 2) The commissioners discussed strategies to build a positive and fun atmosphere during the 2017 Youth Town Hall. Lily will look into the cost and plausibility of the following suggestions:
 - Selfie stations with a Snap Chat filter
 - Hype reels
- 3) The small groups broke off to work on their discussion topics and finalized their discussion questions.
