<u>Agenda Item 4 – Mountain Park Demonstration Project</u>

Bonnie Richardson included in the Urban Forestry Master Plan presentation a piece on the Mountain Park Demonstration Project. This is public/private partnership with Mountain Park Health Center for a clinic orchard which consists of:

- A \$15,000 grant from AZ State Forestry funding the purchase of orchard trees.
- An ASU private donor also contributing to tree costs & outreach.
- Mountain Park is planting & providing drip & deep irrigation from storm water collection.
- ASU is using funds to create an educational program for K-8 students.
- City of Tempe has organized this project to demonstrate how the community can grow more trees.

Agenda Item 5 - Kiwanis Splash Playground

Kelly Rafferty and Keith Burke presented to the board information about the new splash playground coming to Kiwanis Park in the summer of 2018. It will be located near the north soccer field within the park. The new playground will become Tempe's only large water park amenity. An open house was held on Monday, March 13th to receive public input on the following:

<u> Agenda Item 6 – Papago Park Preserve</u>

Craig Hayton thanked the board for the input received thus far and asked for any additional feedback to be sent by end of the week. The next steps will be to go through the public outreach process followed by a formal vote by the board on the draft to move forward to council.

Agenda Item 7 – Golf Fee Increase

Steve White provided a 2017 golf rate increase timeline to the board which included:

- March- Table rate discussion/publish RFP for golf management company
- April- Present plan for course improvements
- May-September- Ken McDonald and Rolling Hills course improvements
- July- New golf management company
- October- continue rate discussion

Agenda Item 8 – Fire Station #7 Update

Craig Hayton explained that due to a canceled council meeting this item was postponed and will not go to council until March 16th. This item will be brought back to the board at the next meeting for an update. It was suggested to bring a diagram of the park as well. Craig also reminded the board that they are looking for someone from this board to sit on a board for this project, Mary Larsen expressed interest.

Agenda Item 9 - Ehrhardt Community Garden Update

Craig Hayton explained that a while back Friendship Village had reached out to the city to partner with neighborhood residents, along with the city to create a community garden at Ehrhardt Park, which is located just south of Friendship Village. A public meeting was held at that time with 60-70 people in attendance and feedback was positive. If this moves forward the next steps would be to formalize a lease agreement. The playground at Ehrhardt is scheduled for remodel in FY2017-18 and it would be ideal to incorporate this as a part of that project. If this request moves forward it will be brought back to the board in the future.
