Take time to train employees to use preventive measure to avoid leaks and spills, to know how to handle spills if they occur, to keep outdoor areas clean (including the curb in front of your facility). If chemicals and other materials are stored outdoors they should be covered and be sure those dumpster lids are kept closed. Doing so can reduce the risk of adding pollutants to stormwater. ### Stormwater Permitting Goes Paperless with myDEQ



As of June 1, ADEQ offers the Regulated Community a digital solution to better assist customers in meeting their Stormwater Construction General Permit (CGP) and Multi-sector General Permit (MSGP) environmental priorities and responsibilities with an easy online tool, available 24/7 to meet your business needs. ADEQ will no longer accept paper applications for the CGP & MSGP Notice Of Intent (NOI) or Notice Of Termination (NOT), and Smart NOI will no longer be available online.
