

PUBLIC INPUT SUMMARY

OVERVIEW

A public meeting was held December 16th, 2017 in Petersen Park to get feedback on planned improvements for Petersen Park. Residents in the area of Alameda to Southern, Priest to the I-10 (183 households) were invited to participate in the process. Eight (8) residents signed in at the meeting, but ten (10) additional residents were present in the park. Surveys were available at the meeting and online from December 8 through December 22, 2017. Postcards directing residents to the online survey were also available during the Petersen House tours throughout the month of December. A total of 7 survey responses were received; 4 at the meeting and 3 online.


If yes, how?
