Comments included:

- How is this program different than kid zone? It targets the children going home alone
 after school and at no cost
- How do you define success, what are the measurements for success? You need to have a goal ahead of time to measure if you're making it
- Who is liable if something happens? The city
- What about adult to child ratio, if you have two people working and a large group of children show up? We do have staff that could be called out if needed to assist. The current national after school standard is 1-20 to 1-25 adult to child ratio
- With this program you could have age diversity, would you have a certain age group that
 would be required to show up with a parent? Staff can look at setting up guidelines to
 address this as part of the program
- Concern expressed with security of children getting to, from and at locations and if a parent doesn't know where their child is
- Guidelines are needed before a program like this is rolled out. Get information from other existing current programs
- How often would it go to each park? Based on our number of parks roughly 4 times per year
- Consider possibly scaling down the pilot and maybe focusing in on a smaller number of parks but for additional visits
- Great partnership with using the parks in a different way
- Like the concept just has some current problems/pitfalls but interested
- Consider for the first month to schedule at a time later in the day that families can come out and get to know what the program is all about
- Research who has the model program and what does it cost to do





Porch Infill Perspective




Porch Infill Elevation







