

PUBLIC INPUT SUMMARY

Overview

A public meeting was held on May 5, 2018 for feedback on planned improvements for Tempe Women's Club Park. Residents in the area of McKellips to Curry, Scottsdale to College (773 residents) were invited to participate in the process via postcard. Notices were posted to Nextdoor to 229 households in 3 neighborhoods directing residents to both the meeting and the website. Signs were also placed in the park announcing the meeting. Eight (8) people signed in for the meeting. Residents were asked to provide input on play structure design, rubber surfacing pattern, and future lighting for the park. Surveys were available at the meeting and online from May 5 through May 19, 2018. A total of 11 survey responses were received, five (5) at the public meeting and six (6) online.

Map of Survey Respondents




1. The top playground equipment selection for Tempe Women's Club Park was a water-themed play structure. Which water-themed play structure do you prefer?







TEMPE WOMEN'S CLUB PARK PLAY STRUCTURE SELECTION




2. A toddler swing could be installed if a slide was removed from the chosen play structure. Would you support the removal of a slide and the addition of a single-bay toddler swing?

4. Currently, since there is no lighting in the park, the park will close at dusk. Should funding become available, would you support lighting in the park? (The park would then be open until 10pm)
