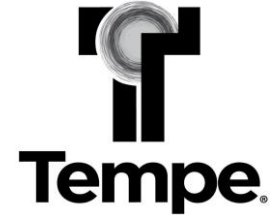


SMITH INDUSTRIAL INNOVATION HUB STAKEHOLDERS MEETING SUMMARY

1. INTRODUCTIONS

City staff introduced themselves. They were: Jill Buschbacher, Economic Development Program Manager, Maria Laughner, Economic Development Program Manager, Chad Weaver, Community Development Director, Ambika Adhikari, Principal Planner with Community Development and Eric Iwersen, Transit Manager for Public Works.

2. INNOVATION HUB PRESENTATION

City staff presented the Innovation Hub Initiative. This is an initiative in which the City of Tempe will attract/grow employment, redevelopment, creatives, enhance connectivity, and bring educators and businesses together to grow their talent pipeline in 8 Key employment corridors across the community. (see map in presentation at Smith Hub webpage)

3. TRANSIT DISCUSSION

Key themes expressed by attendees were:

- Concern about traffic congestion moving goods and services in and out of the area, so adding new users may compound this issue
- Need new sidewalks and lighting to make the area safer
- Suggestion that a new Orbit bus route be implemented to help with moving people in and through the area instead of funding a more costly streetcar extension.
- Safety concerns about loading and moving trucks onto access road at Price/101.
- Questions about what traffic studies were required in order for largest recent developments to be approved. Staff will provide studies for Market Station and Tempe Market Place as requested. The City does require traffic studies for larger developments.
- Some businesses in this area may not need to increase access for customers as they do not have walk-in or storefront operations
- Concern that expansion of streetcar on the north end of the area may result in condemnation of private property

- City has long term plans to extend bike paths throughout the community and hopes to add bike paths to this area as funding is identified
- Safety concerns about pedestrians that use Perry or Smith Road now to walk through area to get to and from Tempe Marketplace as roads are narrow and lack sidewalks
- City has funding to extend Bus Route 48, which will serve part of this area.
- Question about the City's requirement to include public art investment in new developments; This is City policy and is required for projects exceeding 50,000 square feet.
