Chair Wendy Dietrich called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Item 1. Call to the Public.

Item 2. Review and Approval of Minutes - May 7, 2018 Minutes

Item 3. Discussion: Rio Salado Master Plan

Discussion was held on the Rio Salado Master Plan and the need for more accessible activities to be available to the public. An Adaptive Parcourse, installation of accessible exercise equipment along the sidewalk, was discussed. The Commissioners agreed that CDC support would be beneficial. Chair Wendy Dietrich said she was meeting with City Councilpersons on the Adaptive Parcourse equipment. Commissioner Paul Bennewitz indicated he would like to be involved with this project.

Item 4. Discussion: Adaptive Aquatics

Information was provided on programs that provide adaptive aquatic activities at Ability360 and at Tempe Town Lake.

Item 5. Discussion: Mental Health

An informal survey of Commissioners was taken to determine what aspect of Mental Health would be of interest to address in future meetings. These included:

- Local Agencies and Resources
- Job Accommodations
- What Tempe Programs Address Mental Health Concerns
- City Efforts in Tempe on addressing mental health and homelessness Discussion was held on these aspects and Commissioners are interested in all areas, however the #1 topic selected was: "What Tempe Programs address Mental Health Concerns."

Mental Health accommodation programs that currently exist include CARE7 and several other Human Service Programs and Court Programs which serve individuals who are homeless or who have mental and intellectual disabilities,


Commissioner Maranda Childress indicated that she could share information on employer mental health policies at the next meeting.

Staff announced that CARE7 will be presenting at the August 6th CDC meeting, and the presenter will be talking about mental health services provided when they are called out by Police and Fire emergencies and regarding the individuals who are homeless.

Handouts and Fact Sheets were provided from the ADA National Network on Mental Health Conditions in the Workplace and the ADA and from the Job Accommodations Network, which addressed legal issues around mental health conditions in the workplace and practical strategies, that can be used to ensure ADA rights for people with psychiatric disabilities are realized.

Item 6. Discussion: ADA Transition Plan: ADA Story Map

staff. The ADA Story Map
presents data on right-of-way
barriers that need to be
repaired. The ADA Story Map
also includes information on
the 3-year process, what was
surveyed. Future phases will
be added.

- Provide info. to increase access and inclusion (Inclusion and Recognition)
- Promote info. on disability policies and practices (Information Sharing)

Staff announced that there will be an ADA Title II, State and Local Government training on August 14, and all commissioners are welcome to attend. The training will include the ADA Story Map and more. More details will be provided at the next meeting.
