- a. Electrical Outlets for Cole Park Picnic/Activity Area <u>Summary:</u> For all CPNA events, we use the kindliness of our neighbors to supply electricity. This proposal would place electrical outlets near the central picnic tables for community event usage. Unanimously approved at prior CPNA meetings this year.
- b. Traffic Calming Entry Island on East Fremont @ Price <u>Summary:</u> Speeding traffic along Price, entering onto Fremont has caused numerous accidents within the neighborhood. This proposal would create an island similar to the western end to slow traffic entering onto Fremont Drive. Unanimously approved at prior CPNA meetings this year.
- c. Traffic Calming Speed Bumps on East Fremont Dr. Summary: Speeding traffic on Fremont is an endangerment to kids, pets, pedestrians, and cyclists in the neighborhood.
