

Kiwanis Tennis Center Court Renovation



Tempe's newly renovated Kiwanis Tennis Center is bringing the game of tennis into the millennium with high-definition cameras that record every stroke and can be livestreamed worldwide.

This state-of-the-art tennis facility is the first public facility in the nation to feature Playsight video technology on all of its courts, which includes two high definition cameras on each court that record stroke speed and track

analytics while letting family and friends watch the match live from anywhere in the world.

The new courts also have post-tension concrete surfaces with Plexicusion Prestige, which is the official surface of the Australian Open, new fencing, windscreens and 50-foot energy-efficient LED lighting. The courts were completely re-designed and now offer spectator seating between them with shade canopies for an improved viewing experience.

Come experience the courts for yourself. There are a variety of classes for all ages and ability levels ranging from beginners *Learn to Play Tennis* to advance *Adult Specialty Clinics*.
