PROJECT NARRATIVE

In the space provided below, please describe specifically how the City of Tempe's funds will be used:

Mitchell Park currently has a 60' x 60' concrete slab that is not in use in the Northwest area of the park. Over the years there have been many different ideas how to use this slab. With the funds from the Maryanne Corder Neighborhood Grant Programs, Mitchell Park Neighborhood Association would like to install a series of low-impact skateboard equipment to bring a new activity to the park. The money would be used by the winner of the bid to design, construct, ship, and install the equipment.

- 1. Please describe how this project meets each of the guidelines listed:
 - A. Improves health and safety of residents:

This project would expand the range of outdoor activities offered at an already busy local park. Mitchell Park is a very active neighborhood park that offers sporting activities such as basketball, volleyball, and soccer. Since Mitchell Park neighborhood is starting to see an increase of families to moving into the area, we believe that the more outdoor activities offered at their local park; the more likely those residents and children of residents will use those activities, and also find interest in the other activities offered in the park. Also, the area that we are looking to put this project in is an underutilized area of Mitchell Park. This would raise the visibility of this area of the park with the public, and draw more use to that area of the park, lowering the risk of unwarranted activities occurring in this part of the park.

B. Benefits a significant number of residents and/or the City at large:

The city of Tempe is known for the extensiveness of its neighborhood parks, and has a deep history with many of those parks. Many residents of Tempe visit other neighborhood parks and enjoy them during their busy days while traveling through Tempe. I truly believe that the upgrade to any park within the City of Tempe benefits all of its residents, and gives all of the city's residents a new reason to visit the uniqueness of each park. Tempe itself has already recognized this with its current Park Capital Improvement Plan. The multi-Neighborhood Association and HOA group Tempe Neighborhoods Together (TNT) strongly supports any park improvements. I believe that these philosophies fit with this project. Any improvement to a park, is beneficial too all citizens, not just neighborhood citizens.

C. Addresses a known neighborhood deficiency:

Mitchell Park currently does not have any skateboard equipment. There is also a lack of outdoor activities for Junior High to High School aged children currently within the neighborhood. The basketball courts are primarily used by Arizona State Students, the Volleyball Equipment and Soccer Equipment by adults of all ages, and the play ground equipment for elementary aged children. This inclusion of this type of equipment would open up the types of equipment at the park to a whole new age gap. We also recognize that the skate equipment is also welcoming to adults, college students, and even young children.

D. Complements other neighborhood projects (private or City):

As stated above in Question B, there is a strong and known push for all residents of Tempe and the staff at the City of Tempe to make improvements to our park system. Many other neighborhoods are making improvements to their parks, and Tempe has already put in place the Park Capital Improvement Plan. I believe that this project goes hand in hand with those agendas.

E. Provides an environmental benefit, such as water and/or energy conservation:

This skateboard equipment will occupy a concrete slab that has been in place and unutilized at Mitchell Park for decades. This will be upcycling of a currently unused piece of concrete. Also, this project will require no electricity and no water for basic upkeep.

F. Enhances the aesthetics of the neighborhood:

The project will be tastefully done in line with typical skateboard equipment. It will add usage and equipment to a part of Mitchell Park that currently has no infrastructure beyond a concrete slab. It will bring new life into that part of the park. Mitchell Park is central to daily life and enjoyment of the Mitchell Park Neighborhood. It is a meeting place for many different people to come together, and is something that connects us all. Any overall improvement with this park directly improves the aesthetics of the neighborhood.

G. Accessible to all members of the community:

This project will be located directly in Mitchell Park. Mitchell Park is a public park that all can access. There will be no restrictions on this equipment, and currently has a city approved sidewalk already linked to the concrete pad that the project plans to use. Any member of the community that can already visit Mitchell Park will be able to visit this area of the park.

2. Describe how members of the community have been directly involved in the development of the project.

On January 24th, 2016, the Mitchell Park Neighborhood Association had a General Meeting where one of the topics was discussions about what project to pursue for the Maryanne Corder Grant. At this meeting the skateboard equipment was mentioned and decided to be put on the short list of options. The neighborhood board then created a mailer from the city of Tempe to be sent out to its residents, informing them of an open meeting to decide on the Maryanne Corder grant. This meeting was held on February 23rd, 2016. There was also an open call time period that called for suggestions on Facebook and email. The meeting was attended by neighbors from the community, and a non-profit group that is near the neighborhood, *Skate After School*, who volunteered to help with the project. The neighborhood voted unanimously to move forward with the skateboard equipment project.

3. Grant funds can only be used for the capital improvement project, not maintenance. Please describe specifically how the association intends to maintain the project if funded.

Mitchell Park Neighborhood Association will work closely with *Skate After School*, a non-proft, and other local skateboard communities and businesses to help with fundraisers to keep the equipment maintained.

4. If your association has previously received grant funds, please share how they have impacted your neighborhood.

In 2015 Mitchell Park received grant funds to complete a traffic circle at the intersection of 12th and Judd. Ever since the inclusion of the traffic circle, the neighborhood has been safer for pedestrians and bicyclists. In 2014 Mitchell Park was awarded grant funds for stand pipe and bench mosiacing. The standpipes have made the neighborhood more appealing to walk and bike through, and the placement of an additional bench that was decorated made Mitchell Park itself more desirable to visitors. In 2013 Mitchell Park East and West did a combined grant to build art on the median on 13th and Hardy. This art was a welcoming addition to show to visitors that you are about to enter a special community, it also reminds those of us that live here that we are home. In the past Mitchell Park has put in speed bumps on 13th, to make the community safer for pedestrians and bicyclists alike. All of these improvements have helped set Mitchell Park apart from other Tempe communities, and the improvements help Mitchell Park retain part of its history and charm of being one of Tempe's oldest neighborhoods

5. Outside of grant projects, please describe any other activities your association has participated in (i.e. GAIN, Adopt-A-Park, food drives, etc.) within the past year.

Mitchell Park has done many neighborhood activities in its own boarders and with the Wilson Art Garden District. These activities have included: numerous grant dedication ceremonies, annual Wilson Art Garden District/Mitchell Park potluck in Mitchell Park, GAIN night with Wilson Art Garden District in the Wilson Street Community Garden, The annual Dick McQueen Memorial Bike Parade, a community run "Free Little Library" in Mitchell Park, weekly sand volleyball pickup games in Mitchell Park, and food and clothing donation drives for Tumbleweed Youth Center.

6. What is your proposed timeline for the grant project?

We plan to use the timeline according to the requirements stated in the City of Tempe guidelines. Construction will begin after a bid is selected and scheduled. The project will be completed by the deadline.




