Agenda Item 3 - Presentation: Arts Engagement Update

- Julie Akerly, Arts Engagement Specialist, presented results for 2019 <u>Arts in the Parks</u> programming.
 Details are found in Document A, attached and include:
 - Arts in the Parks is an Arts Engagement program with support from Neighborhood Services and Parks. The program is initiated by and programmed with residents to reflect the identity and values of each park's community.

- In its second year the program visited 6 parks and had 2,750 attendees. The program involved more residents in the planning process, receiving input from 1,345 residents and involved 74 Neighborhood and Homeowner's Associations.
- The program also included 5 Tempe schools, 4 community partners, and support from 11 city programs including Public Art, Edna Arts, Tempe Playlist, Kid Zone, and Play Mobile.
- Maja Aurora, Arts Engagement Administrator, presented information about <u>Arts Engagement</u> programs.
 Most project details can be found in the written report. Additional details include:
 - O Distributed brochure for the Edna Arts Summer Camps, which are managed by Dani Godreau, Arts Engagement Coordinator. Children aged 6-12 can attend daytime camps with activities including movement, theater, visual arts and ceramics. Camps run from June 3-August 2, 2019. Adult arts classes are also available during the summer months.
 - O Arts Grants are available to non-profit organizations who want to create arts programs within the city limits. Last year the city funded 31 arts organizations in three categories: TCA Excellence Grants, Community Arts Grants, and Arts Festival Grants. For the coming grant cycle, three TACC volunteers are needed to each participate in a grant panel to read through grant applications and cooperatively determine recommendations for grant recipients and grant values.  - o <u>Tempe Playlist: Saturn Sessions</u>
 - Tempe Playlist has received grants from the Arizona Commission on the Arts/Herberger Institute of Art and Design's Arizona Creative Communities Institute for two years in a row. These grants first funded the creation of two podcasts of south Tempe musicians and poets, and recently has brought those artists to perform in the community. The first event was held at Changing Hands Bookstore on April 29, 2019 and included artists from Compadre High School, Marcos de Niza High School, Corona del Sol High School, and a professor from ASU. Additional performances are being scheduled for the coming months.
 - The Tempe team for this program is comprised of Aaron Thacker representing TACC, Gayle Shanks from Changing Hands Bookstore, Maggie Fountain, the Arts Liaison for Tempe Union High School District, Artist Samuel Pena, and Maja Aurora from City of Tempe.
 - Tempe Playlist has recently been awarded a \$10,000 grant from the National Endowment for the Arts which will help fund additional podcasts of south Tempe artists. This is the first NEA grant the City of Tempe has received for community arts programming.
 - The astronaut graphic on the Orbit buses are a part of the marketing and visibility of the Tempe Playlist: Saturn Sessions program, literally serving as vehicles for the arts.

Agenda Item 4 - Discussion: Tempe Arts & Culture Award Review

- Joy Higgins, Administrative Assistant, initiated a discussion about the planning and realization of the first Arts & Culture Awards. Details and feedback include:
 - 22 nominations were received, the selection panel recommended five recipients and five categories of award.
 - March 13, 2019, TACC approved the recommendations.
 - Recipients were notified by mail and email of the Tempe Arts & Culture Awards and the award ceremony to happen at the State of the Neighborhoods event on April 13th.
 - Tempe staff completed all administrative work to prepare for the event. Three weeks proved a short amount of time to prepare, along with other regular work duties.
 - Award certificates were designed by a city graphic designer and signed by Mayor Mark Mitchell. Award frames were painted by a local artist.
 - Planning for future years:
 - Categories are best left open so that they can be customized to the award recipients.
 - The selection panel can be given access to review nominations ahead of the meeting.
 - Marketing for the next call for nominations may include:
 - Photos and more description in the press release.
 - Flyers to hand out at GAIN Night, neighborhood events, public meetings, etc.

- Announcement in Tempe Today (water bill flyer), TCA programs, and other printed newsletters.
- Adjusting the timeline back one month will allow adequate time to plan and prepare. Dates for the 2020 awards can be scheduled as follows:
 - Call is open from December 2019-January 2020
 - Selection panel meets the week of February 5
 - TACC approves selections on February 12
 - Administrative work through March, and completion of all details prior to the State of the Neighborhoods event in April
