Asset Inventory and Assessment



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• Purpose is to inventory and assess primary assets such as:

- Facilities (Kiwanis Recreation Center, restrooms, lake...)
- Activity areas (fields, courts, picnic areas...)
- Amenities (benches, grills, picnic tables...)

 Provides a database to allow staff to quickly assess the inventory and assessment to aid in park planning and replacement budgeting efforts


Asset Inventory and Assessment



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- Kiwanis Park dates to 1974 and includes 125 acres and features:
 - The Kiwanis Recreation Center and wave pool
 - 12.7-acre lake
 - Three playgrounds
 - Splash playground
 - Multiple active recreation fields and courts
 - Open space areas with 3 miles of internal walkways (non street edges)
 - Multiple ramadas
 - Large group areas
 - Additional amenities




