Commission Member Jill Oliver felt the ideas shared at the August retreat is duplicative of services CARE7 already provides; Ilene agreed. Jill would like to research why crimes within the scope of the Tempe Family Justice Commission are so underreported. Commission Member Kristen Scharlau wants to identify any gaps in the community not being served or a segment of the Tempe population that feels underrepresented that CARE7 isn't aware of. Commission Member Beatrice Kastenbaum would like to improve connections with Mayor and Council; Ilene agreed and feels the Commission needs to improve its marketing and communications to the Tempe community however creating videos is beyond the scope of the Commission. The Commission expressed concerns over the submitted proposal for an Advocacy Center; Deputy Human Services Director, Paul Bentley shared the proposal has been submitted to Mayor and Council through the minutes and to the Mayor's Chief of Staff. The Commission continues to encourage each other to contact various Councilmember's by phone or email in hopes to pursue a future conversation about the drafted proposal.

The Commission committed to provide awareness and identify challenges surrounding domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, and sex trafficking through story-telling and data. Additionally, the Commission commits to gathering this data to create talking points in order to be very clear in the message of the Commission either through a marketing document or one-on-one conversations with Mayor and Council. Kristen will share a list of events CARE7 tables surround Domestic Violence Awareness, Sexual Assault Awareness, and Human Sex-Trafficking awareness month and welcomes members to attend.

Karyn shared her involvement in the East Valley Mayors' Prayer Breakfast where featured speakers share their personal stories of community leadership and involvement and suggested drafting a proposal for Tempe to host a similar breakfast and/or social hour.
