

Parks & Recreation Master Plan Public Input Summary

July 16 - Aug. 2, 2020

I. OVERVIEW

The City collected feedback on recommendations for recently completed key components:

- RECREATION PROGRAMS ASSESSMENT: Recommendations that provide program and service delivery strategies.
- RECREATION LEVEL OF SERVICE (LOS) Measures the number of people per 10,000, that each facility or park amenity serves, in order to determine amenities & facilities needed to keep up with changes in population.
- PARKS CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM: A system that organizes parks to help guide activities, use and maintenance:

The provided feedback will help inform the master plan to ensure it reflects the vision of the community.

The topic was posted online for comments from July 16 - Aug. 2, 2020 on Tempe Forum. A total of 178 unduplicated survey responses were received.

II. OUTREACH


Several methods were used to notify the public about the online survey.

III. <u>SURVEY RESPONSES</u>

There were 178 survey responses.

- 73. Instead of website surveys, which skew towards white people in their homes instead of the people who actually use the parks, why not conduct surveys of real park-goers. I live next to Jaycee Park. The basketball courts are full and being used every single day. Baseball field is only used for soccer and people playing catch. The fact that your "evidence" shows people want more baseball diamonds has nothing to do with who actually goes to parks.

Not 51 courts as listed in this graph, but 18. Even if there were 51, 15 of the city's 51 courts are at Kiwanis Rec center has the disadvantage of cost and schedule. A court added to Stroud Park would give east access to the community, adding to the park. More splash pads would also be a boon to the community.

Arizona Roller Derby is just one org that has been around for 17 years now that wants to take our sport to parks and rec. there are other skating groups as well across skating genres that would love to have a space to teach roller skating as a part of a broader program. Tempe should take the lead and making a space for this overlooked sports genre.
