

# 1. PROJECT DESCRIPTION/BACKGROUND

Effective sanitation services are vital to protecting public and community health and safety by collecting refuse, recycling and bulk items and transporting this material for proper disposal, re-use or re-purposing. These essential services provide a higher quality of life and long-term savings for residents and commercial customers.

Every two years, Tempe's Municipal Utilities Department retains a third-party financial consulting firm to assist staff in conducting a cost of service or "rate" study for the solid waste services utility. Rate studies help the utility determine the financial viability of the Solid Waste Enterprise Fund and determine if changes are necessary to proportional cost allocation or revenue requirements to ensure cost recovery and the long-term financial health of the utility.

Tempe City Council will be considering the recommendations of the Solid Waste Rate Study and any adjustment to solid waste rates, fees or charges, which would take effect in January 2022. The City is seeking input from the Tempe community to determine what programs and services are most important to them.

Tempe Municipal Utilities is committed to ensuring the fiscal health and viability of the solid waste services utility and remaining operationally efficient by managing and controlling costs, while delivering superior services. Since City sales and property taxes do not fund Solid Waste Services, operational and other costs must be collected through monthly user service fees.

### 2. PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT OBJECTIVES

Tempe values public input and believes that all community members should be informed about decisions that affect them. The purpose of the Public Involvement Plan (PIP) is to create an open and transparent process to inform residents about how utility rates, fees and charges are determined.

# The scope of the 2021 Solid Waste Rate Study PIP is to:

- 1. Provide objective information to assist the public in understanding the process for determining solid waste rates, fees and charges.
- 2. Provide solid waste customers with the opportunity to share input with staff regarding the City's provision of solid waste services.
- 3. Provide timely information regarding the rate study process, how revenue requirements and rates, fees and charges are determined and how adjustments to rates, fees and charges are implemented.
- 4. Seek and encourage the involvement of community members by many methods including suggestions from the City's Equity in Action Coalition Equitable Engagement Framework.
- 5. Provide a variety of opportunities and means for the public to contribute ideas and provide feedback throughout all phases of the process.
- 6. Ensure accessibility and engagement of interested community members, and those not typically involved in local government activities, during execution of the rate study process.



### 3. STAKEHOLDER ANALYSIS

An early step in the Public Involvement Plan is to identify the internal and external community members that have an interest in the process.

# 4. INVOLVEMENT TECHNIQUES & COMMUNICATION APPROACH

Public involvement and communication techniques will vary depending on the phase of the rate study. The approach will be to work directly with the public and stakeholders throughout the process to ensure that public input and ideas are consistently noted, understood and considered.

While traditional methods (meetings, presentations, etc.) still play an important role in public engagement, new participation and communication tools will also be used to disseminate information accessibly and broaden outreach to meet people where they are and to include underrepresented communities. In-person engagement may be modified due to Covid-19 restrictions.

# 6. PUBLIC AND STAKEHOLDER MEETING SCHEDULING, LOCATION & ACCESS

Three public meetings will be held during the rate study. The first two will introduce the rate study process and provide an opportunity for public involvement. The third public meeting will present and review the findings and recommendations of the rate study and provide an opportunity for public involvement. Outreach activities will take place throughout the rate study process, as indicated in the project timeline.

Public meetings and events will be scheduled to maximize attendance. Meetings will be held online and will be accessible to persons with disabilities. With 48 hours advance notice, special assistance will be provided for persons with sight and/or hearing impairments; a Spanish translator will be made available for the meeting. Meeting materials will be translated into Easy English and Spanish.
