Our Estate La Colina neighborhood feels these ID sign toppers will be a great enhancement to our community. This project has been discussed numerous times over the past several years during voluntary neighborhood board meetings and community gatherings. ELC recently received new metal signage that is located at our 4 entrances and are ready to enhance and provide consistent neighborhood identity with ID sign toppers.

The ELC voluntary board reached out to our community in a variety of ways asking for input. An initial letter was mailed March 11, 2021 requesting voluntary dues as well as asking for ideas for our next grant application. We received no suggestions. A second letter was mailed April 14, 2021 explaining the community idea of the ID sign toppers. We asked for comments and thoughts to be shared via our Facebook page or dedicated ELC email address. A Facebook post on our ELC page was posted a week before the letter was received. See attached documents that include both letters, Facebook post and comments.

Should Estate La Colina be awarded grant funds, our community would be thrilled! Currently our neighborhood is only identified at four entrance points. Having our name prevalent throughout our 380 homes will provide visible identification and encourage community engagement.



Request for Voluntary Dues

Great News! Estate La Colina has been awarded a Grant from the City of Tempe for new entrance signs at the four entrances into our neighborhood. This is a huge win for our neighborhood. Since ELC is not a HOA, this award will allow us to make a capital improvement to our neighborhood that would not be possible without the Grant funding.

To prepare for the installation of the new signage, the existing walls where the signs will be placed require repair and paint. Stucco is falling off in many areas. The entrances also need some clean-up and landscaping. There are many overgrown bushes and plants that are blocking the view of the walls where the new signs will be placed

To move forward with this project, the Board is asking for \$25 voluntary dues from all homeowners so that we can repair and paint the walls at our entrances. More than 3 years ago when asked for voluntary dues, there was an overwhelming response, thank you. We are extremely fortunate to live in a neighborhood where there is no monthly maintenance or HOA fees.

What is a Neighborhood Association?
