# <u>Agenda Item 5 - Deputy Director of Library Services Recruitment Update: Keith Burke, Community</u> Services Department Director

- Keith Burke (K. Burke), Community Services Department Director, announced that the Deputy Director of Library Services position recruitment is underway.
- K. Burke explained that the process will include representation from city of Tempe Library Services Division staff members, as well as members of Tempe's Library Advisory Board and Friends of the Tempe Public Library.
- K. Burke noted that the first review of applications occurred on Tuesday, March 16.
- Teri Metros, Library Advisory Board (Board) Chair, thanked K. Burke for the update.

### Agenda Item 6 - Staff Report: Katie O'Connor, Interim Deputy Community Services Director

- Katie O'Connor (K. O'Connor), Interim Deputy Community Services Director Library Services
  Division, reported the following information specific to the March 2021 operations of Tempe
  Public Library's (Library) Youth Services area:
  - The **Kid Lit Picks** program, a librarian-curated book recommendations service for kids, pulled 50 items for five (5) patrons;
  - As a direct result of funding received from Friends of the Tempe Public Library, 400 Youth Activity Packs were developed and distributed by staff;
  - Facebook Live Storytime attendance totaled 217 views;
  - Twelve (12) one-on-one ESL classes were held;
  - A handful of teens continue to attend a weekly Zoom Teen Hangout;
  - Planning for the 2021 Summer Reading Program is well-underway;
    - The Maricopa County-wide program will be virtual;
    - This year's theme is titled, "Tails and Tales!";

- From June 1 to August 1, 2021, participants of all ages may log up to 20 minutes of reading every day, enter secret codes, complete challenges, and visit community experience locations in order to earn prizes;
- Online registration begins on May 1.
- K. O'Connor further reported the following information specific to Tempe Public Library's (Library)
   Adult Services area:
  - o 74 adults were engaged in **programming** in March 2021; programs included:
    - Mystery Club;
    - Writers' Connection;
    - Writing About Family Events;
    - Book Chats;
    - Great Books discussions:
    - Sustainability: Drip Irrigation Maintenance, Troubleshooting, and Repair;
    - Coffee, Tea and Books discussions.
  - The 2021 Writing Contest winners have been selected and a book of their works is being printed;
    - Friends of the Tempe Public Library (Friends) sponsor Tempe Public Library's(Library) Writing Contest, including the \$50 cash prizes award to winners in each contest category.
    - The Library staff team remains grateful to the Friends for its sponsorship and loves to encourage local writers through the contest.
    - The 2021 Writing Contest is conducted in partnership with **Arizona State University**.
  - Preparations are well-underway for FanCon 2022;
    - The Library hopes to have the event in-person but is also planning virtual aspects.
    - Should the Library need to pivot to a virtual event, it is prepared to do so.
- Grab-n-Go Seed Library Packets will be available for pick-up beginning Wednesday, April 14;
- Friends of the Tempe Public Library (Friends) will host a **sidewalk sale** from 8:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. near the main entrance to Tempe Public Library on Saturday, April 10;
  - o The Friends Book Store will open on Monday, April 12.
- Year-to-date, there's been a 13% increase in digital materials check-out;

- In comparison to pre-pandemic numbers, there's been a **50% decrease** in physical check-outs;
- Conversely, there's been a continued increase in physical check-outs (approximately 2,500 per month) since October 2020;
- Public access computers within the Library's computer lab saw 592 uses in March 2021;
  - The lab at Escalante Community Center saw 242 uses;
  - o The lab at North Tempe Multi-Generational Center usage saw 171 uses.
- Tempe Public Library continues to maintain an average attendance of 1,159 patrons per week, or 231 patrons per day;
- Eight (8) boxes of books were taken to the Escalante and North Tempe Multi-Generational Centers last week to be placed within the **rotating book collections** at each center;
- All 150 Chromebooks and 200 Hot Spots have been cataloged and entered into Polaris as part of the Connect Tempe Grant program;
  - The equipment loan agreement and program application document have been translated into Spanish; both documents are pending review for approval and online publication.
  - The Connect Tempe team continues to research methods and protocols for income verification appointment scheduling so that all screenings are done in a safe manner.
  - In partnership with Tempe's Homeless Solutions team, Valor on 8<sup>TH</sup> and the Super 8 motel will receive four (4) Chromebooks and two (2) Hot Spots to be placed within a meeting room for public, supervised use.
    - Chromebooks are being placed within these locations in an effort to best meet and service populations where they're at.
