Pet waste contamination

When left on the ground,
bacteria and pathogens in pet
waste can be carried
by stormwater runoff into
waterways and parks. Since
stormwater runoff is not treated,
this waste can become a health risk
to humans and animals.

Make a difference by properly picking up after pets.

- 1. Bring a bag.
- 2. Pick up your pet's waste.
- 3. Dispose of waste in the garbage.

Storm drains are designed to collect stormwater runoff and prevent flooding by carrying stormwater away from developed areas. Stormwater is not treated, so it must be kept free from pollutants.

Some of the most common pollutants found in stormwater runoff include:

- Pet waste
- Litter
- Yard debris
- Vehicle engine fluids
- Soap, dirt and oils from residential car washing
- Fertilizers and pesticides

Help keep the environment clean. While the actions of one household might contribute small amounts of pollution, the combined affect of an entire neighborhood or community can have a serious effect.
