# PUBLIC INPUT SUMMARY NOVEMBER 2021



## I. Background

The City of Tempe works to offer opportunities for play, shaded spaces, and comfort in our neighborhood parks. Towards that effort, up to two picnic ramadas are scheduled for Svob Park. If there is not a majority support, in the form of written or online responses, for the addition of a picnic ramada, the city will explore additional shade in the park.

#### II. Outreach

Several methods were used to provide bilingual information to the public regarding the project, meeting and opportunities for input.


- Two direct mail postcards were sent to 1,546 households in the project area, from Southern Ave. to Baseline Road, I-10 to 48th Street. The first with meeting and survey information and the second as a reminder to provide comments.
- Email notification to neighborhood and homeowners' association contacts inviting them to attend the meeting or to comment online and share with their neighborhoods,
- Email notification to relevant Boards and Commissions inviting them to attend the meeting or to comment online.
- An open house was held on Oct. 16 at Svob Park with approximately 15
  attendees and a virtual public meeting was held on Oct. 18 with 5 attendees. A
  recording of the virtual meeting was made available online.
- Doorhangers were delivered to all homes bordering the park reminding them of the online survey deadline and encouraging participation.
- The topic was posted on the project website for input from Oct. 16 through Nov. 1, 2021.
- Project website was available.



#### Why or Why Not?


#### "Yes" responses:

#### "No" responses:


- 1. Due to the amount of homeless in the area.

- 5. Don't believe they would be used that often. They encourage homeless to use them as a place to live. People won't clean up after themselves.

Normally, I think the answer would be "yes, that's great" from neighbors, but our fear of people taking up residence under the shelters, would run our neighbors off from enjoying the park. The sports teams that practice at Svob, be it soccer, football, or the basketball court, have great parent participation, and having additional seating and/or overhead shade @ those locations would be a welcome site. Would be great for neighborhood meetings also, but the fear of the park taken over, combined with the lack of involvement from the neighbors, makes things difficult to get a consensus.



3. Please choose your TWO (2) favorite ramada locations from the four options shown on the map:




SVOB PARK SITE PLAN AND RAMADA LAYOUT LOCATION OPTIONS





5. Which color do you prefer for the ramada roof?






- Off leash area (dog park)

Please select the enhanced amenity you would most like to see in Svob Park:




Please select the enhanced amenity you would least like to see in Svob Park:

#### Cleanliness of Svob Park





#### Safety of Svob Park






- 1. I haven't had interaction w/park staff (12 years)

#### 8. Additional Comments

- 1. Thank you for the opportunity for input. Please help keep our community safe. Anything that encourages homeless to stay.
- 2. I think additional shade sails picnic bench/benches along perimeter of park just somewhere to rest
- 3. More improvements like restrooms, horse shoe pit, dog park, corn hole, etc. would be welcome.
- 4. It would be nice to provide shade for the athletes and their parents during the games. A light color (for the ramada roof) would uplift heat.
- 5. Trash cans need to be covered better. Flies made eating at a picnic table near the cans very unpleasant. I am a senior with a bad hip. I like walking around the edge of the play area on the rubberized mate. It is much easier on bad joints. Longer walking trails of this material would be wonderful.
- 6. General observations. Svob is a very busy park, especially with sports practices. Dog park has come up before but that would draw in folks from all around, as sports do currently, and clean up can be a real challenge. Cleaning up excrement would be an issue, lack of respect / responsibility abounds. Noise, fighting, normal dog park behaviors in open spaces like Sports Complex on Hardy etc, one thing, not so much in neighborhood. A few residents often do the clean up @ surrounding areas as it is already. "Buy in", is a challenge, trying to gain majority vote. Last Grant cycle, we directed our efforts to park, as several complain about needing perimeter seating, overnight lighting east sports field. But when we accepted/added suggestions for either of the popular complaints, little to no support. And/or lack of any participation. No Grant paperwork submitted.
- 7. additional police presence would be helpful in this area in general. lots of packages get stolen, cars broken into (if unlocked at least), bicicycles stolen, meth and heroin using vagrants / beggars from I/10 and baseline use this area as a pass through. they go north on wendler drive and cut over west on

vineyard, from there they go south on filer to fremont drive, or stay on vineyard and branch off wherever.


