Alameda Meadows Neighborhood Association Selleh Park Standpipe Project Letter of Interest / Projected Budget / Timeline

Tempe is my hometown and I grew up in the Broadmor neighborhood, going to school, playing baseball and frisbee, trying to stay out of trouble, and living the full Tempe experience. While at ASU, I did much of my teacher's aide work at Curry School, with 2nd and 4th graders. I believe that tile mosaic artwork on that standpipe will engage the students, neighbors and passersby in a variety of ways, and help Tempe build their identity as a destination for travel, living, education, and work.

To enhance the standpipe in Selleh Park, I would enlist neighborhood participants, collect and discuss ideas, and integrate some of those ideas into a mosaic composition. Mosaics would create interest in this outdoor area, and last for generations, providing beauty and learning experiences for students and visitors to the park. As an artist, I excel in the details in motif, aesthetic appeal, construction, and safety.

It is my hope that the Alameda Meadows Neighborhood Association will give serious consideration to my application for the Selleh Park Standpipe project, and trust my experience and public art work has made me remarkably ideal to create a long-lasting project that the City of Tempe can be proud of.





Good morning-

The structure is a standpipe, used for irrigation. From the art side of things, the answer is YES you can apply to commission an artist who works with tile or metal or both to create mosaic work to be applied to the exterior of the standpipe. The current amount available for the grant is \$20,000 however artwork for one standpipe is likely to be half of that amount. With that in mind, if the neighborhood wants to apply for more than \$10k I advise that we meet and discuss how the additional funds would be proposed to be used in the art project.

As for the placing of artwork within the park itself, I'll defer to Dave for his thoughts.


