Additional picnic tables for Mitchell Dog Park are needed in order to help build community and make dog owners feel connected to the communities where they live. Mitchell Dog Park has only 2 picnic tables, but has room on concrete pad for more tables. With Mitchell Dog Park usage increasing as population grows, visitors are needing tables to converse and socialize, work on laptops, place leashing on, place beverages on, while dogs are playing in order to enhance the park's use-ability.

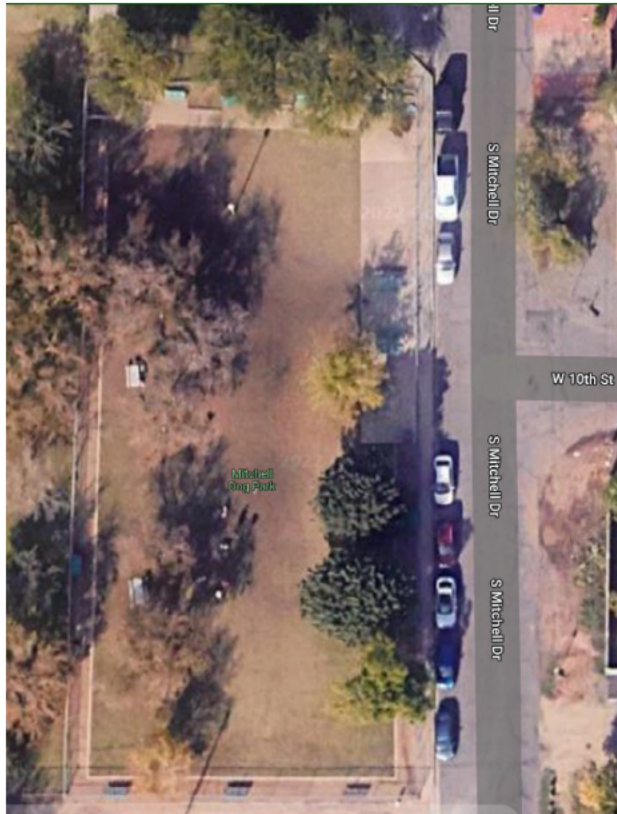
Mitchell Dog Park has seen more visitors and dogs in the past couple years, as the city's population is growing rapidly. City of Tempe provides benches for dog owners to sit but its hard to communicate if more than 3 people want to sit down together. With more residential units being built around the downtown Tempe area, Mitchell Dog Park is a popular go-to location for dog owners. Mitchell Dog Park is located in the Mitchell Park neighborhood and many Wilson Arts and Garden neighbors and dogs visit. Wilson Arts and Gardens neighborhood is in close proximity to Mitchell Dog Park and feel that this project will benefit the entire neighborhood and City of Tempe citizens. There are currently 2 picnic table and benches , as 1 picnic table was removed due to rust about 5 years ago. But there is room for total of 5 picnic tables and benches on the current concrete pad. Tables provide a vehicle for neighbors to congregate, along with providing a table to place laptops, cell phones, drinks, dog leashes, purses and backpacks, and dog toys. This equipment was selected, located and spaced with ADA considerations. It fits into existing park maintenance and has been coordinated with the parks department (Dave McClure).

Hello Wilson Art & Garden Neighbors,

Thank you to all of you who came to the neighborhood association meeting. We had some good discussions, and it was nice to have Laura Kafjex from Tempe Neighborhood Services there to answer questions concerning Maryanne Corder Grants and the Downtown Neighborhood Transportation Safety Plan. Please see further information from the meeting below:

Maryanne Corder Grant Application

Applications are due April 25th. We had only one idea for a grant proposal. Karen Morrissey suggested the idea of purchasing more benches for the Mitchell Park Dog Park. The dog park is in the Mitchell Park Neighborhood, but many of the Wilson Art & Garden neighbors and their dogs use it. The idea was unanimously approved and Karen has agreed to write the grant proposal.

Repair and relocation of damaged public art on Farmer

The public art called **Cyclist Feat**, which consists of four pieces, located in the chicanes near 13th St. and Farmer, and the chicanes near 9th St. and Farmer, has been damaged a number of times by vehicles. The City would like the art to be removed from the chicanes and placed in two different locations on Farmer Ave: **Southeast corner of 9th and Farmer** and the **Northeast corner of 10th and Farmer**. We were told that if they aren't moved to one, or both of those locations, the art would be decommissioned (removed completely). We asked if all four pieces could be moved to the corner of 10th and Farmer where there is more room and better visibility. **The artist has agreed to this and will redesign the artwork so that it can be reconfigured for the corner of 10th and Farmer. The timeline has not yet been determined.**

Garden Update

The garden is no longer under the umbrella of a nonprofit organization. The garden area is available for private plots, however you will need to supply your own water. If you are interested please contact Amy Madden.

Downtown Neighborhood Traffic Safety Plan

Laura Kafjex told us that the City had received a large number of comments both during the testing phase and after it was completed. They are currently looking at the data along with comments from the residents, the Public Safety Department and the Waste Management Department. Using this information they will develop potential plans which will be presented in a public meeting to be held in May or June.

Election of Wilson Art & Garden Neighborhood Chairperson

Joe and I have completed multiple terms as Chair, and at this point have decided to step down. We had one neighbor who was considering filling the position, but decided against it due to time constraints. 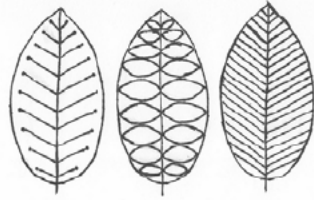
